BOSTON FISH MARKET

BOSTON, July 19.—Since last report, eight swordfish trips have arrived at T. wharf, aggregating 700 fish. This large amount has sent the already low price down another peg or two, and this morning the fish sold at 3 1/2 and 4 cents per pound, the lowest price thus far this season and also the lowest for some time before.
There are no fresh market in, but ten of the mackerel fleet bring more haddock than the market wants, but not enough codfish, the latter being in good demand and bringing fine prices, large fish selling this morning at 36 and 36 1/2 per hundred weight.
Pollock are still a good seller and brought 34 this morning. Hake, like haddocks, are not wanted very badly and sold at from \$1.50 to \$2.50 for large fish, while haddock went from \$1 to \$1.75.
The steam trawlers Ripple and Foam and both among this morning's arrivals and each has a small fare, in fact there are no large trips at all in the ground fish line.
Frank Bushlaecko, commodore of the T. wharf, Italian fleet, reported that his men had brought in 200 barrels of herring yesterday, caught in the traps of Nabant, and that 97 baby albacore, weighing from ten to twenty pounds each, had come in from off the New Jersey coast. A lot of whiting also came to the commodore, but were sent to East Boston for freezing purposes.

from Puebla. A factory owned by Sanchez Gavito was attacked by Madrist soldiers who also raided the ranch of Enrique Silva Langer, who is said to have been killed. His miles were slaughtered and farming implements destroyed.
Workmen attacked and wrecked a factory near Atlixco San Martin Tecomulcan just across the line in the State of Tlaxcala, was raided by Poens.
The outbreaks were coincident with departure of Francisco I. Madero for Tehuacan where he arrived last night. The Madrist soldiers acted in protest against the attempt to disarm them.
The workmen were actuated by a labor grievance, and they took advantage of the withdrawal of the Madrist guards to raid the village which was without protection of a garrison.
