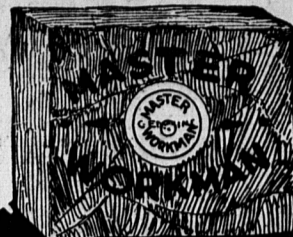

EGG CIRCLE

Notes on the Prince Edward Island Egg Laying Contest for the 24th Week Ending April 16th, 1924.

The cool weather of the past week did not hold back the birds in the present contest. There was an actual gain of 62 eggs over previous week making a total for the week of 917 and to date 13,193 eggs. There were only two hens that did not add some to their score. Hen number 5 in pen 6 owned by J. Spurgeon, Jenkins laid 26 eggs in the 6th four weekly period. Two of the S. C. White Leghorn eggs owned by the Experimental Station laid 203 and 201 eggs during the same period. 16 hens have passed the 100 egg mark since the Contest began.

Rev. A. McAulay's Barred Rocks tied with the Expt. Stations pens 13 and 15 for second place with 51 eggs each. Mrs. Halliday's Barred Rocks tied with Mrs. Fred McIntyre's White Leghorns and the Experimental Station pen of Barred Rocks No. 10 for third place with 48 eggs. D. F. McDonald's Barred Rocks tied with Sam McPherson's White Leghorns and the Experimental Station pen No. 14 for fifth place with 47 eggs each. J. Spurgeon, Jenkins Barred Rocks tied with Everett Howatt's White Leghorns for sixth place with 49 eggs each. The Expt. Station Pens of Leghorns Nos. 14, 13, 12, and 15, were 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th in the contest to date with 933, 917, 900, and Contest began. Pen No. 12 owned by the Expt. Station led for the week with 52 Leghorns were 6th with 755 eggs.

Sam McPherson's Leghorns were 8th with 751 eggs. J. J. McGillivray's Leghorns were 7th with 701 eggs. The Expt. Station pen of Rocks were 8th with 687 eggs. Everett Howatt's Leghorns were 9th with 663 eggs, and Mrs. F. Halliday's Rocks were 10th with 654 eggs. The Contest is 1922 eggs ahead of the same period last year. J. A. Clark, Superintendent.

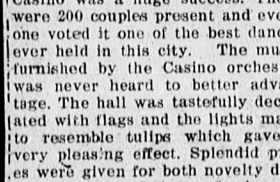

"St. George for England" By Bessie Kellaway

St. George, so it is said, first appeared as England's patron saint at the instance of Richard Coeur de Lion during the latter's campaign in Palestine.

He was not a character in history although said to have been a martyred Roman soldier. Yet this half mythical hero striving in an eastern desert against an impossible monster became a new and a new inspiration for a new England.

With the Crusades England had stepped from an acceptance of things to adventure, and the epic of her ship had begun. Need we wonder then that the battle cry of St. George for England having its origin in a movement which opened up a vista of endless opportunities for a coming nation, should ring down the ages and find an answering echo in the hearts of the seamen who were engaged in a mightier struggle than St. George encountered?

Tradition never dies. Who shall say whether the angel at Mons was a reality or a mere figment of the imagination? What caused the whisper that went the rounds of England's battlefields during the dark days of 1917, that the roll of Drake's drum had been heard along the dim and distant horizon? And who shall question the inspiration which prompted the famous Raid of Zeebrugge, carried out on St. George's Day 1918, when the old battle cry St. George for England once more rang out, and a modern dragon in the shape of a menacing German navy, received its death-blow?

England had once again proved worthy of her position in the very vanguard of chivalry and bravery. The spirit of St. George still lives. As long as we have ears to hear and hearts to remember St. George's Day will be linked with Zeebrugge Day and all that that meant to a nation set free from the German menace.

We thank God that England with all the faults and failings she may have, has been true to her great traditions. We thank God her sons have never failed no matter what the danger or loss and Zeebrugge Day stands out as proof that their courage is the same today as in days of old.

Oh little land of England! Oh mother of hearts so brave! Men say this trust shall pass from thee Who guardest Nelson's grave. Aye, but those bragbarts yet shall learn, Who'd hold the world in fee. The sea is God's—and England's. England shall keep it free.
