The Guardian's Eastern correspondent writes: Cropping is about completed—later than the average on account of the season. The winter past is one of the longest on record and rendered the junction between the two years' cattle feed a little far apart with some of our farmers. Good fishing on the old time cod grounds from South Lake to Little Harbor is a far rather discouraging. Never were such preparations made, never were so many fishermen engaged, never were such facilities provided for the disposal of the fish. A gasoline launch comes up the shore every few days buying up the fish, in all stages of curing, or fresh from the knife, and conveys them to the fish dryer in Souris, where they are fitted for market by the most modern methods. A few mackerel have been netted at Basin Head, but not the usual quantities. Seth McLean captured a porpoise a few days ago. There have been immense catches of lobsters at East Point, and along the North Side. Our eastern cheese factories are running with a fair supply of milk. John J. Smith is again cheese-maker at Red Point, where he has given satisfaction every season, and this is his eighth year. Work on the alcohol factory at Baltic Road is proceeding with vigor and despatch. Much may be expected from it in developing our resources and giving employment to our population and thus keeping the boys and girls at home. Visitors from other parts are beginning to arrive. Mr. McEwen from Moral and Freeman Bowley from Marie spent Sunday east. Mrs. Euphemia McLean, Dandus is visiting her sister, Mrs. S. S. R. Roberts. PARIS, June 25.—A profound sense of relief pervaded the French capital last night at the check of the outbreak in the South, which is described by Premier Ribot as the worst internal crisis in France in the past thirty-seven years. The Government is now apparently satisfied that it has the situation well in hand. Overwhelming forces of troops garrison the whole area to prevent a recrudescence of the armed revolt against the central power. Such a mobilization of military been witnessed in the life of the third republic. The despatches represent that a general surface calm prevails, although there are one or two storm centres in isolated districts. Both civil and military authorities, however, have made ample preparations for all eventualities.
