COLD NOVEMBER VISITS ENGLAND

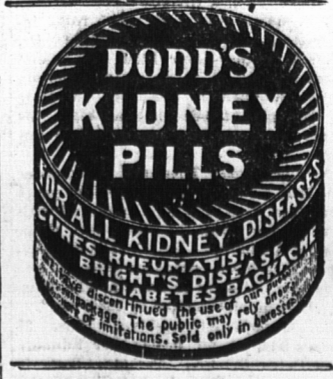
LONDON, Nov. 6.—November has already justified the apprehensions that in a year when winter practically began in the middle of October it would be a month to be dreaded even more than usual.
