**The War This Week**  
 By Don Gilbert

Headed by President Roosevelt's pledge of aid to Britain "until total victory has been won," the directors of Britain's Balkan plan in the 81st week of the war to build an effective barrier to further German advances in southeastern Europe.  
 A British army of 200,000 was reported reliably to be in the course of debarkation at Greek ports and dispatches from correspondents with the British fleet told of a steady stream of ships bound for Greece under the protection of British naval units in the Eastern Mediterranean.  
 Foreign Secretary Eden, who has established a close liaison between the war cabinet and the Middle East command, flew from Cairo to Cyprus to confer for a second time in recent weeks with Sukru Saragolu, the Turkish Foreign Minister. In a frontier town the governors of Greek and Turkish territory met to discuss the menace of the German army across the border in Bulgaria. The diplomatic tussle over Yugoslavia continued, because German armed forces practically surround the country, the Germans appeared to have an advantage in the negotiations, with partial Yugoslav capitulation to Nazi demands de-

ed likely but British sentiment among the Serbs ran high and none could be sure that last minute developments might not tip the scales in Britain's favor.  
 While German action was awaited, the Greeks maintained their fine fight with the Italians, repulsing Italian attacks with heavy losses. Unconfirmed reports said Tepeleni, the object of Greek operations in recent weeks, had been entered. All sources agreed that the Italian army is becoming increasingly demoralized.  
 In Africa the British forces made progress in the siege of Cherem, the fall of which is expected to signal the collapse of Italian resistance in Berke.

**German troops 35 years!**  
 German troops, hurled in waves at French defenses about Verdun, were repulsed at Douaumont, March 17, 1916 but four days later captured Avocourt Wood and started an encircling movement south of Malancourt. The plan brought temporary success in the long drawn out battle for the great French fortress.  
 British airmen brought off a spectacular feat March 20, successfully bombarding the Port of Zebruge. At the same time British naval units chased three German destroyers into the Belgian port.

**NEW YORK, March 21—(AP)—**Leading stocks were thrown for losses of fractions to two or more points in today's market.  
 Small declines predominated in the Canadian section. Among the losers were Dome and Lake Shore Mines, Walkers, Ford, Hollinger and Bell Telephone. S. B. & S. International Nickel were steady. The Associated Press average of 90 stocks was off 3/4 of a point at 414, low mark of the week. The day's drop was the largest since March 13. Transfers totaled 471, 650 shares against 490,140 the day before.  
 Some preferreds of Engineer Public Service, Standard Gas and Electric Power & Light were up as much as 2 points or more at new highs for the year but senior issues of Commonwealth and Southern, American Power & Light and Philadelphia Co. slipped.  
 Pere Marquette preferreds and those of Bangor & Aroostook ended well ahead.  
 Among prominent losers were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, U. S. Rubber, Sears Roebuck, International Harvester, Douglas Aircraft, Wright-Aeronautical, Standard Gas common, Westinghouse, Dow Chemical, Eastman Kodak, Santa Fe, Great Northern, Phelps Dodge, Anaconda, Western Union and Consolidated Edison.
