"But you are so—I had been about to say 'rich' but changed it—'unlikely to need money.'"

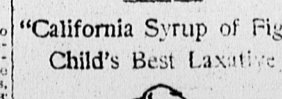

Madden and Magin were second with 31 points and Eaton and Hill third with 27 1/2 points.

AGREES WITH DRURY

OTTAWA, Jan. 21.—J. E. Brethour, of Burford, Ont., one of the officials of the Ottawa Winter Fair, which opens here tomorrow, was one of the speakers before the Rotary Club here today. He asserted that there are certain elements in the country districts at the present time agitating their own interests to the detriment of all industries other than agriculture. He declared that all farmers are not so narrow-minded as to overlook the fact that the farmer and the rest of the population are interdependent. "We do not want class legislation," he stated. "There must be co-operation between the farm and the city rather than the feeling of antipathy towards the agriculturist that would inevitably result from a purely farmers' legislation. One interest should not be paramount."

Mr. Brethour was glad to see Premier E. C. Drury take such a strong stand on the question of class legislation and expressed himself heartily in sympathy with the Premier's views. Although Mr. Brethour was strongly in favor of farm representation, he would not support a government that considered only its own interests. In this he thought he would have the almost undivided support of the more influential farmers.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—The Dempsey-Carpentier match has not been called off and will be held either in England or Canada on July 2. Promoter Tex Rickard is quoted as saying in an interview with the Evening Sun, "Canada has made several very attractive offers and we expect to stage the mill there, probably in Montreal."

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—A letter read at a meeting of the Davis Cup committee of the United States Lawn Tennis Association indicates that a tennis challenge for the international trophy may be issued soon by Canada.

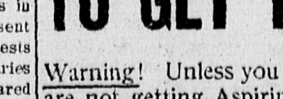
