THE I. O. F. CHANGES.

Mr. Editor.—The legislation enacted by the Supreme Court of Foresters at Toronto last week, does not concern the public. But inasmuch as most all of the two thousand members in this Province read The Guardian, I am persuaded to accept your invitation and briefly explain the recent changes, that will go into effect October 1st, 1908.

A number of representatives to the Supreme Court, including those from New Brunswick, Illinois and England went to the meeting opposed to any changes. A committee of twenty-five had been summoned to Toronto one week earlier to look into the whole question of rates, and when their report was tabled it was unanimously agreed that if the Order desired not to be prohibited from doing business in many of the best states in the union, and possibly in Canada an increase in the rates for those who joined previous to 1909 must be made.

The second plan was recommended by Mr. Stevenson, and known as his. The rate was somewhat higher than the "Myers" plan. The third was known as the "Hunter" plan, and recommended that members pay the National Fraternal Congress rate at their present age. This would create a legal reserve high enough to satisfy any actuary or insurance department in the world. This had a small of Commercial Insurance, and had few supporters.

The discussion on a motion to adopt the Myers plan, was warm, sometimes hot, and lasted two days. One of the best speeches was made by Mr. Anderson (the P.E.I. Island Scotchman as he was called by an English delegate.) He had given the question much study and proved by the records that the Actuaries were often mistaken in their calculations as to how long a man or a society would live. At the close of the second day by a show of hands thirty eight representatives still wished to "make a speech." It is evident that a majority favored the Myers plan, but as it required a two third vote to amend the constitution in this or any other part, a man with one eye could see a deadlock ahead.

Mr. W. Fraser, M.P., Toronto proposed an amendment which was a little higher than the Myers plan, and was regarded as a compromise, and adopted by a vote of 158 to 53. This basis of rate for the old members was not new to the writer, as Mr. W. Schuman of Bellevue suggested it to me after the Summerside meeting. Five different ages are here given for the benefit of your readers who are interested.
