Our National Railways

not fluctuate proportionately with the traffic. An example of this might be illuminating.

Suppose the daily expenses of operating a mile of railway were:

- (1) Maintenance of Way and Structures \$5.00
(2) Maintenance of Equipment 5.00
(3) Traffic Department25
(4) General and Miscellaneous Expenses40
(5) Transportation Expenses 10.00

\$20.65

If there were five trains operated over that mile, the cost per train mile would be \$4.13.

If an additional train were run, it would not, initially at least, increase item (1) practically at all.

Item (2) would increase slightly. Items (3) and (4) would not be noticeably increased, and of item (5) about half the expenses would increase proportionately, so that for six trains instead of five the expenses would be approximately:

- (1) Maintenance of Way and Structures \$ 5.20
(2) Maintenance of Equipment 6.00
(3) Traffic Department25
(4) General and Miscellaneous Expenses40
(5) Transportation Expenses 11.00

\$22.85

It is thus seen that total operating expenses per train mile have been reduced from \$4.13 to \$3.81

by the fact that an additional train has been run, and transportation expenses per train mile are reduced from \$2.00 to \$1.83.

On the earnings side, the advantage is still more evident, assuming that the five trains were only producing average earnings of \$4.00 per train mile, or \$20.00 per day, or a loss of 65 cents per mile per day.

The additional train would take the gross from \$20.00 to \$24.00 per mile per day and a net of \$1.15 would result.

Of course a greater net would result if the additional traffic would be handled on the trains now operated.

It has been pointed out in a previous article that the Maintenance of Way expenses are the hardest for a line of light traffic to carry.

The above example shows how additional trains help to carry the load.

In making a general comparison with all Canadian railways for the year ended June 30th, 1919, it is found that on a per mile per day basis the expenses of all other Canadian railways are 40 p. c. greater than are those of the Canadian National, the earnings of other railways are, however, 83 p. c. greater and other Canadian railways run 42.3 p. c. more trains per mile of line per day than the Canadian National. The figures for the above and the traffic units moved per mile of line per day are as follows:

(6) Number of tons of freight moved 1.57

From the above it may be contended reasonably that expenses in 1919 were not out of line with those of other railways, and the increases in expenses which took place in 1920 increased considerably the difficulties of the National System. The increases in freight and passenger rates did not, on account of the character of its traffic, provide the same benefits. The explanation of the former is found largely in the operating ratio. The effect of a 30 p. c. increase in wages for eight months on a line operating at a ratio of 115, is quite different from the effect of the same increase on a line operating at 81.4. Assuming that the same proportion of labour exists in both cases, say 62 p. c. in the first case the wage increase means an increase of \$21.39 in expenses per \$100 gross, and in the second case an increase of \$15.14 in expenses per \$100 gross. For eight months this makes a most material difference as can easily be seen.
