RHODESIA DOES NOT FAVOR UNION

LONDON, Nov. 6.—(Special).—Coincident with the expressed wish of General Louis Botha, prime minister of the Union of South Africa, that Rhodesia should enter the Union, the South Africa Company has issued a circular with proposals for the encouragement of immigration, in which it is pointed out that there are in the colony 59,000,000 acres of land suitable for European occupation, of which 23,000,000 acres are owned by the South Africa Company.

The proposal is made that a land settlement board should be constituted by ordinance of the Legislative Council, with statutory powers to acquire, improve, sell and lease land. It is also suggested that a land commissioner should be appointed to be resident in London, to inform and help emigrants. Free or assisted passages are among the recommendations.

The comments of the Rhodesian papers on Premier Botha's speech are unfavorable on the question of joining the South African Union.

Call for tenders for Steamship Service Between Quebec and Natashquan

TENDERS for a Passenger, Freight and Mail Steamship service are invited and will be received at the office of the Minister of Trade and Commerce, Ottawa, until noon of the fifteenth day of December, 1913.

The service is to consist of regular sailings from Quebec to Natashquan and return as follows: Every 10 days from such date as the conditions in the River St. Lawrence will permit up to May 15th, 1914; and every 10 days from November 15th until the ice conditions in the River St. Lawrence will no longer permit of the running of a steamer over the said route.

The contract to be for a period of five years from the opening of navigation as above described in the year 1914. The contractor is to land and embark passengers at all ports of call at his own cost and expense. The tenders shall be subject to such conditions as are incidental to all similar contracts. GILLETT'S LYE EATS DIRT.

WARSHIP IS FLOWN UP BY WIRELESS.

LONDON, Nov. 5.—A warship has been blown up by wireless of Portsmouth during an experiment with a mysterious invention which the admiralty is testing. The ship on which the experiment was being made was the third class cruiser Terpelchore, a vessel of 3,400 tons. She now lies in a dock with her bottom blown out. Details of the invention are jealously guarded, but it is known that for some weeks before the experiment was made the vessel was in dockyard hands and that a mysterious metal box was fitted to the bottom of the ship. On Wednesday morning last the ship was towed to Stokes bay, and from a battleship eight miles away the material contained in the box was exploded by a wireless ray or spark.

There was a vast upheaval of water and the cruiser was afterward seen to have a heavy list to port. Five dockyard tugs, waiting in the distance, closed in on the cruiser and by means of powerful pumps kept her afloat until she was safe within the docks.

It is not thought that the invention has anything to do with the "X rays," though, apparently, it is similar to the Multiva "discovery."

LLOYD GEORGE IS IDOL OF ITALY.

LONDON, Nov. 4.—David Lloyd George, chancellor of the exchequer, is the most popular man in Italy, according to Welshmen returning from the continent.

The common people of Italy, in discussing the British Statesman, say that his well-known measure such as pension for old-people, insurance etc., rare greatly needed in Italy. Whenever Lloyd George speaks in or out of parliament, every word he says is printed in the Italian papers. Much more space is given to his speeches than to the utterances of the prime minister of Italy. His remarks are read avidly by workmen who can read to their friends who cannot. Britain's questions are Italy's questions. There are movements in each country in the same direction, and the Italian workman believes that the British leader is the prophet of the new era.

MORE CATHOLIC DEPUTIES ELECTED

ROME, Nov. 6.—(Special).—It was said at the Vatican yesterday morning that the Pope had expressed satisfaction at the election of six more Catholic deputies on the second ballot of the Italian general elections and also that he was pleased at the defeat of the candidates in Rome supported by the coalition of Radicals, Republicans and Socialists, which has been in control of the municipality for so long a time. The defeat also of the former priest, Father Remolo Murri, leader of the Catholic Democrats, was noted with interest.

Mayor Nathan of Rome will shortly convolve a meeting of the Aldermen of the city, at which it is expected he will present his resignation.

As a municipal election is to take place in June next year, it is assumed that the Government will in the interim appoint a Royal Commissioner.

PRICE COLLIER DIES SUDDENLY.

COPENHAGEN, Nov. 4.—Price Collier, the author of Tusido Park (N. Y.), died suddenly today while on a visit to Count Weddel on the Island of Funen in the Baltic Sea, where he had been invited to participate in a shooting party. He was 53 years of age.
