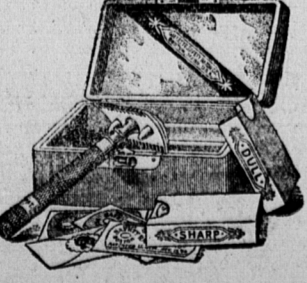

Services were conducted by Rev. R. McDonald, P. P.—Westville Etc.
