## MR. CHAMBERLAIN'S IDEAL.

In his speech at the Australian merchant's banquet in London the other day Mr. Chamberlain indicated more clearly than we have before noticed the manner in which imperial union of the British Empire may be brought about. The first step will be closer commercial union and this he hopes to see secured by his scheme of preferential trade. He contemplates that this will lead to the creation of a council to consider the innumerable details of commercial interest. Such a council, Mr. Chamberlain thinks, must inevitably make recommendations regarding other than the purely commercial interests of the imperial states. Thus he feels that, following the evolution of Germany, or in some such fashion, the British people may proceed from the Zollverein, or commercial union to the Reichsrath, or imperial council, when the problem will be solved, and "blessed will be those who have promoted the solution." He recognizes that this happy ending can only be achieved by goodwill and voluntary agreement. It cannot be forced. He is willing to labor and to wait. Whether the noble ideal shall materialize in the near or distant future, before or after Mr. Chamberlain has passed from life's activities, his name will be inseparably linked in history with the movement for imperial unity.

## HOW THE HOUSE DIVIDED

The House of Commons by a vote of 167 to 9 the other day refused to repeal the indemnity bill, commonly known as the salary grab. Of the nine who voted in the minority eight were Conservatives and only one a Liberal. Three Cabinet Ministers, Aylesworth, Oliver and Fitzpatrick, were out of the House when the vote was taken. Three Privy Counsellors, pensioners, were also out of the House, Sifton Foster and Haggart. Hon. John Costigan was present, but asked to be excused from voting, being an interested party. Messrs Hughes, Martin, McLean and Lefurzey, representing Prince Edward Island, voted with the majority to retain the \$2,300 indemnity. The Guardian has done what it could to show them the error of their ways but our counsel has not been heeded. It remains to be seen what the party conventions will do when the time comes to select candidates again. It also remains to be seen what the people will do when they come to vote with the above record before them.

All honor to the Tourist Association, whose most faithful and energetic workers are among those who have nothing to gain by the tourists coming to visit us. Others who ought to be interested, if only for their own advantage, are quite indifferent. But a lot of good work has been done, many letters of inquiry are coming to hand and being promptly answered, and we learn that the season promises to be an exceptionally successful one.

The Queen's County Temperance Alliance has entered heartily upon the work of preparing for the election on June 7 at which it is intended to repeal the Scott Act that the Prohibitory Law may take its place. Public meetings will be held with a view to arouse general interest and to convince any who may be in doubt as to the desirability of the change. Men to look after the polls on election day will be provided and a general effort made to induce the electors to turn out and vote. We trust that all good citizens will heartily co-operate in this excellent work.

The death is announced at the advanced age of 87 years of William Mutch, of Hopeton, long and favorably known as an elder of Zion Church of this city. He was one of the founders of this church. In the creation of a splendid farm out of the forest across the Hillsborough he has left an enduring memorial of his well-directed industry. In the church he will be long and affectionately remembered for his consistent Christian life, his inspiring example, and his constant effort for the good of those about him. Mrs. Mutch has been some years dead. The surviving children are W. Aubrey Mutch at home, Miss Anna B. Mutch of the Hotel Alexandra, Mrs. (Rev.) A. W. McLeod of this city and Mrs. (Rev.) George W. Fisher, California.
