**Small Cruisers Like H. M. S. Psyche
When on Business Need Not
Salute.**

New York, October 23.—Of the visit to this port yesterday of the British third-class cruiser Psyche which ran in and then ran out again without saluting, having come to secure an absconding paymaster, Sir Percy Sanderson, the British command said to-day:

"The Psyche ran in merely on a matter of business. I have received no official communication that the Psyche did not salute Governor's Island when she passed. It is not true that Major Myer, of Governor's Island, who was prepared to respond to the expected salute has made any complaint. It frequently happens as a matter of naval regulations that a matter of a small number of guns need not fire an international salute.

THE FIGHT IN ST. JOHN.

In two cases in the present political campaign leaders of great prominence in their respective parties are directly pitted against each other. This is the case in Brandon, Manitoba, where Hon. Clifford Sifton, Minister of the Interior, is opposed by Hon. Hugh John Macdonald, who held the same portfolio in the late Conservative Government. The interest of the contest in Manitoba and the Northwest centres in this great political duel. At the last general election there were three candidates in Brandon, the late D'Alton McCarthy winning the seat by a majority of 335 over the Conservative candidate, while there was also a Patron candidate in the field who received over 1100 votes.

But even greater interest centres in the contest in St. John City where Hon. A. G. Blair, Minister of Railways is opposed by Hon. George E. Foster, ex-Minister of Finance. Both candidates are running in St. John for the first time. These two gentlemen have great prominence in their respective parties in the federal arena generally, and are their respective party leaders in the Province of New Brunswick. Mr. Blair has long held a very great political control in the Province of New Brunswick, in provincial affairs as the local Premier there, and since his entrance to the Dominion Cabinet has been reinforced by the support of Hon. John Costigan, a former Conservative Minister and a leading Irish and French Catholic of the province. Of Mr. Foster it may be said that he has been in the federal arena from his first entrance to public life and never in the local house.

St. John city returned Mr. Ellis Liberal at the election of 1896, by a majority of 722 over the Conservative candidate, Mr. Chesley, but Mr. Pugsley was also in the field as an independent candidate and received 1472 votes. This time there are but two candidates, and Mr. Pugsley, now Attorney General of the Province, is supporting Hon. Mr. Blair. There is, however some uncertainty as to how the majority of the independent vote of last election will be cast. The situation is further complicated by the elating of interests between the Canadian Pacific Railway and the Intercolonial. The C. P. R. threaten to withdraw their export business from St. John unless Mr. Blair will make certain concessions to that great and rich corporation which he refuses to make. It seems therefore, at this distance that the influence of the C. P. R. which is by no means inconsiderable, will be thrown in favor of Mr. Foster and against Mr. Blair.

It is also mentioned that the St. John Development Club, a social and sporting association to which reference was some time since made in these columns, and which numbers some 600 young men, has decided to give its unanimous support to Mr. Foster. It may not seem probable that entire unanimity will prevail among so numerous a body, but the club is no doubt a factor to be reckoned with. None the less the Minister of Railways, who rather enjoys a stiff fight, has not abated anything of his confidence, while Mr. Foster professes a like assurance of success. Both parties are contesting the ground with unexampled vigor and St. John bids fair to be about the hottest corner in the Dominion on the 7th of November.

It has been arranged that the member of the Contingent returning to St. John shall arrive in the morning. The I. C. R. will furnish sleeping cars for their night trip from Halifax. The militia, the fire department, the fraternal and benevolent societies, with numerous bands, will escort them from the station in procession. In the evening there will be a plentiful display of fireworks, a torchlight procession, etc.

It may interest our readers to know that in the great political contest now going on in St. John city the candidates of both parties are not only temperate men but lifelong total abstainers. Mr. Blair was born in 1844 and Mr. Foster in 1847. Mr. Blair is a Methodist and Mr. Foster a Baptist. Mr. Blair first entered public life as a member of the House of Assembly in 1878. Mr. Foster was first elected to the Commons in 1882.

In compliance with a general and spontaneous desire to present the returning volunteers with a cash gratuity on their arrival, subscription lists have been opened and money will be received for this purpose at Apothecary Hall, the Hotel Davies, the Revere Hotel, the Examiner, Patriot and GUARDIAN offices. The object is a laudable one, and we trust will be generously supported. It is quite apart, of course, from the Monument Movement with which it is not intended in any way to interfere, for which all arrangements are being perfected as rapidly as possible.

The Little Queen of the little Kingdom of Holland has announced her betrothal to Duke Henry of Mecklenburg-Schwerin. She is herself a beautiful woman, and is provided by her loyal Kingdom with an abundant income to maintain her royal state. Queen Wilhelmina was twenty years of age in August last. She is credited with the statement that she would never marry; except for love, so that it may be presumed the betrothal is based upon mutual affection. Duke Henry, on his part consents to abdicate his citizenship in Mecklenburg and become a naturalized citizen of Holland. In another respect his position will be somewhat anomalous, as he will become the subject of his wife. It is to be hoped she will always exercise her authority with gentleness and justice.
