THE REV. DR. J. A. GORDON RETURNS TO MONTREAL.

Rev. Dr. J. A. Gordon, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Montreal and formerly of Charlottetown returned on Friday last from London, England, whither he had gone as a delegate to the first World's Congress of the Baptist denomination. Dr. Gordon remarked that the chief feature of the congress, was the realization it brought home to Baptists everywhere of the size and strength of their church. The convention set itself on record as being opposed to any system of Church and State in education, and while it refuses aid from outside sources in the United States, for example, there is an educational property value of forty-five million dollars. Rev. John McNeill of Winnipeg, was one of the strongest men in the gathering, which had 5,000 delegates and from what Dr. Gordon said the young Western giant caused quite a sensation among the most prominent men of the church. Montreal was represented by three pastors of local churches, Dr. Gordon, Rev. J. L. Gilmour and Rev. J. R. Walsh. Dr. Gordon, himself, was compelled to cut his visit short on account of illness being laid up for nine days in Dundee, in a rather serious condition. As a result he was unable to follow out the plan he had formed of taking charge of the congregation of Hampton Heath, London, during the month of August. Dr. Gordon is now somewhat recovered.


