Abbies Go Into Lead In Island Playoff Series

Pounding the offerings of the veteran "Doc" Noonan for eleven safeties and taking full advantage of numerous Summerside errors the Abbeville baseball team last evening captured the third game of the Island intermediate playdowns when they defeated the western representatives 11 to 1. The local victory gave the City representatives a 2-1 edge on the series and shot them to within a single game of the provincial crown.

Starting in early the winners piled up a 5-0 lead in the first two frames and from there on were seldom in danger. Ernie Robin, brilliant pitcher was seldom in danger as he let down the visitors with four scattered blows while striking out twelve. He was always in control of the situation and showed his worth, particularly in the fourth frame, striking out two batters in a row after Summerside had crowded the paths with but one out. His effort for a shutout failed only in the ninth when a base on balls, fielders choice and damaging error pushed Schurman across the plate with his team's only run.
