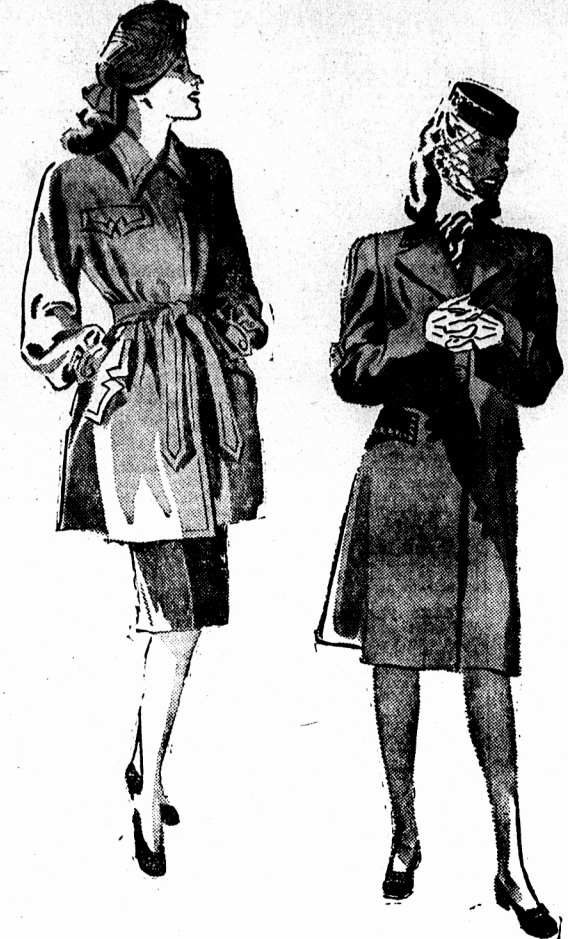

**British Plans For Workmen's Compensation**

LONDON, Nov. 1 — (CP) — The British government, proposing to treat workmen's compensation as a social service instead of a liability of the employer, has published a white paper outlining the proposals.

The new scheme is scheduled to take effect at the same time as the general scheme of social insurance. Here are the highlights:

1. It will cover all persons working under a contract of service or otherwise, except those under school age, and to non-manual work without any income limit, and will apply to accidents arising from and in the course of employment and to specified industrial diseases.

2. Compensation, instead of being on the individual employer, will be on a central fund out of which all benefits and administrative charges will be paid.

3. Earnings likely to amount to £300 a year (about \$300.00) or twice the amount paid out in workmen's compensation before the war.

4. The weekly contribution required for men will be about 10 cents, for women eight, and for children six, and the employer will pay half the sum. The employees' share will be paid out of the social funds required to come from the treasury.

5. Pensions paid under the new

scheme will not be affected by any subsequent earnings of the workman.

"This system is in many respects like that which is the basis of war pensions schemes," said a recent government white paper outlining the proposals.

"It thus recognizes a certain similarity between the position of the soldier wounded in battle and that of the man injured in the course of his productive work for the community."

"Neither is liable to have his pension reduced on account of what he may earn after the injury; each is compensated not for loss of earning capacity but for whatever he has lost in his strength and his power to enjoy life."

The proposed scheme is a radical departure for Britain where, for nearly half a century, the compensation of workmen has been a liability imposed by law upon the employer. Inevitably compensation has become a disputable issue between the two parties, and a subject of public controversy. Right along the line its payable have been related to the estimated loss of earning capacity.

Now benefits will be paid at flat rates with supplements for family responsibilities. In the first weeks after injury, while the workman is incapacitated, there will be injury allowances at uniform rates. Later, if his disability is prolonged, there will be industrial pensions based on the extent of his loss of earning capacity.

The pension will not be affected by any later earnings and—except in some cases of minor disability—will not be replaced by a lump-sum payment considered one of the benefits of the old system. There will be pensions for widows, parents and certain other dependents of those who die from industrial injury.

Benefits will be the same for men and women.
