EXISTENCE OF THREE ROYAL FAMILIES IN EUROPE RESTS UPON OUTCOME OF THIS WAR

THE HAPSBURG, THE ROMANOV AND HOHENZOLLERN ALL VITALLY AFFECTED—ONE OR TWO OF THEM, PERHAPS ALL, WILL RECEIVE A TERRIBLE BLOW—THE CURSE OF THE HAPSBURG

The Emperor of Austria, the German Kaiser, the Czar of Russia—these are three of the men whom Fate has chosen for the most terrible game the world has seen.

Hapsburg, Hohenzollern, Romanov— one, of two, perhaps all three of these ancient royal families must receive during the period now upon us, a blow that will dim their glory.

What, then, are these king-families? In the first place, Francis Joseph is not a pure Hapsburg. He is descended from that house only in the female side, from Maria Theresa, who, late in the eighteenth century married Francis Stephen, Duke of Lorraine.

Radbot's son, Werner, and his grandson, Otto, were called Count of Habsburg, or Hapsburg, as the name came to be spelled.

The Hapsburgs did not again reach the German throne until 1438. Then Albert of Hapsburg inherited from his father-in-law, King Sigismund, the kingdoms of Hungary and Bohemia, and was chosen and crowned king of Germany.

Turning to the Romanoffs, or the Romanovs, as they are more correctly called, this paradox is found—the family of the Czar who represents absolutism to the world, gained the throne by popular election.

The Romanovs had little association with the court of Russia before the election of Mikhail in 1613. In 1598 the ancient ruling line of Rurik ended with the death of Czar Theodore I. For 12 years Russia seemed to be in the throes of dissolution and Sweden and Poland disputed for the possession of the land.

FAMOUS MILITARY LEADERS KILLED ON FIELD OF BATTLE.

PARIS, Sept. 15.—In a late list of casualties made public is the announcement of the death of General Charles Roques, who was killed by being struck in the head by a bullet near Bar-Le-Duc, and of Captain Raoul Duconeddi De Kerouartier. The latter was a grandson of General De Montebon and a great-grandson of "Brave" Duguay, a celebrated Breton sailor who commanded La Surveillante in 1799 in the famous fight with the British ship Quebec.

CARONIA NOW ARMED CRUISER.

HALIFAX, Sept. 15.—Evidently to prepare for the transportation of Canadian troops, and specially protect the Canadian trade routes, the Admiralty have organized another squadron, relieving those ships which have been doing such excellent service over the North Atlantic since the commencement of the war.

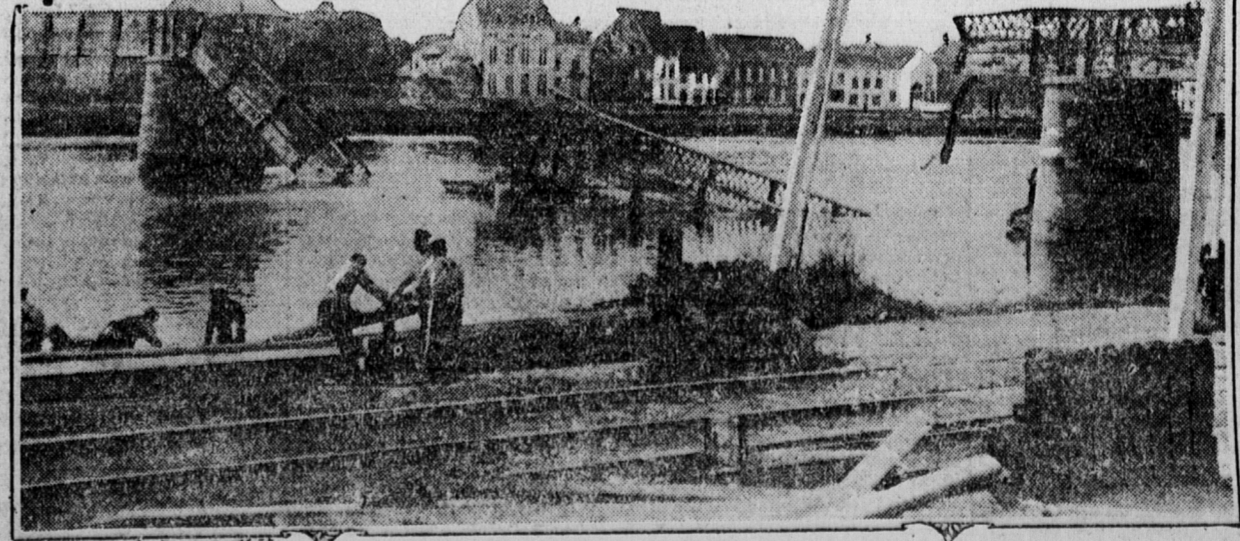
What ships will comprise the new squadron would not be given out by the Admiralty last night. The arrival in port of the Caronia yesterday was in connection with the naval changes. This converted cruiser of 19,687 tons was requisitioned from the Cunard line by the British Government.

LONDON, Sept. 15.—A despatch from Capetown to Reuter's Telegram Co. says that the Fourth South African Mounted Rifles, commanded by Colonel Daetson, after two night marches, surprised the German force, which had occupied a drift sixty miles from Steinkop, in the Namaqualand. After a sharp skirmish the Germans were compelled to surrender.
