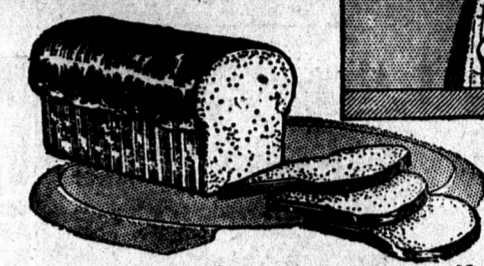

Solution To Parley Problem Expected

(Canadian Press) LONDON, April 2.—Reijiro Wakatsuki, head of the Japanese naval government, this afternoon delivered his Government's reply regarding a tripartite agreement negotiated in London to Secretary of State Stimson and Premier MacDonald. It was stated in conference circles that the answer as already predicted from Tokyo was a virtual acceptance of the agreement. Mr. Wakatsuki explained the Japanese reservations which are said to be of such nature that they will not upset the agreement among the three nations. The meeting of Wakatsuki, Stimson and MacDonald was at St. James Palace, and shortly afterward merged into a five power meeting with the arrival of the Foreign Minister, Aristide Briand and the chief Italian delegate, Dino Grandi. The British United States and Japanese delegations will meet again tomorrow forenoon to discuss the reply further. The United States spokesman said this afternoon that there was every indication that the negotiations would result in solution of the United States British-Japanese problem.
