

# ANOTHER WEDDING AT THE WHITE HOUSE

NEW YORK, March 24—Prospects of another White House wedding became more definite recently when the persistent renewal of the report that Secretary of the Treasury, Mr. William McAdoo, and Miss Eleanor Randolph Wilson, youngest daughter of President and Mrs. Wilson, were engaged, the marriage to take place in June.

There was no announcement from the White House, and when the attention of officials was drawn to the report they refrained from making any comment or denial.

Mr. McAdoo himself said it would be indelicate for him to comment on the subject one way or the other. Nevertheless, official Washington is taking it as a definite fact that another White House wedding will be solemnized in June after the adjournment of Congress.

# THREE HUNDRED SCOTCH FAMILIES

ST. JOHN, March 24—The colonization company promoted by Mr. W. Leonard Palmer, of London, and which has secured some 20,000 acres of land in Queens county, proposes to settle on the land some 300 Scotch families. That there is a room for a hundred thousand settlers in the Maritime Provinces is the opinion of Mr. Palmer, and he says there is a concerted movement on foot on the part of several local governments to inaugurate a campaign with a view to increasing the number of settlers in these provinces. The land is within the vicinity of the St. John Valley Railway system.

## BURN AND GIVE AWAY DURING HOUSECLEANING

Use your spare moments before and after straightening up every drawer in the dressers and chiffoniers. This will help one later.

Clean upstairs first. Do the curtains, shams, and stand-covers and down-stairs, the curtains, cushion-covers, etc., and have them ready. Finish one room before starting another.

For windows, mirrors and picture glass use a tablespoonful of kerosene to a large basin of hot water. Choose a dull day for window cleaning, as the sun is apt to blur the glass. Use the cheapest cheesecloth for cleaning. It leaves a clear shiny surface and no lint.

For finished floors and linoleums add half a cupful of crude oil or furniture polish to a pail of tepid water. Keep your mop clean by washing in another water occasionally. Put your pail on an old chair so you will not have to stoop to wring. Use an oil rag on the woodwork, and it will retain its finish and keep clean.

Go through your closets and wardrobes. Don't shift all the old clothing up to the attic. Burn what is useless and give the rest to needy persons. Give away your old magazines and papers, too.

When cleaning carry a notebook and pencil in your pocket, and jot ideas as they come; repairs that cannot be done at the moment, for their repairs should be seen to as each room is finished; anything needed to be purchased, etc. Finally, don't forget to keep pace with the neighbors.
