THE MARKET.—There was a fair attendance at the market yesterday. Eggs were selling at 38c to 40c; butter 45c to 50c; chickens \$1.00 to \$1.25; ducks 90c; plums 20c per qt; crab apples 3c a qt; and blueberries, which were scarce, 15c. There was a good supply of fresh and corned fish selling at 7c while mackerel sold at from two for 25c to 30c each. Outside, hay sold at \$1.80 and oats 65c to 70c.

WASHINGTON LEASES BAR

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 8.—The "anti-jazz" clause has made its appearance in Washington in leases submitted by an agent for a rental apartment house in the north-west section. Phonographs are classed with dogs, cats and parrots in the lease submitted to the tenants, who are also asked for increase in rent.

The "lessor hereby covenants and agrees that he will not keep or allow to be kept any dog, cat, parrots, gramophones or phonographs in said apartment or upon said premises," reads one clause in the lease.

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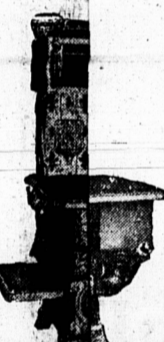
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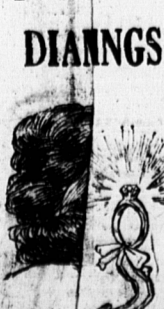
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LEAGUE WILL ELECT WORLD JUDGES SOON

CARRY YOUR LUNCH, ADVISES COOPLY HAMILTON, Ont., Sept. 9.—That the only solution of the problem of high prices charged in restaurants is for the patrons to carry their lunches from home and boycott them, is the opinion of Mayor Cooply, who today announced that he would call the Police Commissioners together for the purpose of holding an investigation. Citizens who have been complaining to His Worship about the prices charged for "eats" will be invited to attend and state their cases. If it is shown that excessive profits are being made, there will be action taken, it is promised. His Worship agrees with the suggestion recently made that the owners of the eating houses are not reaping the harvest but the men who own the places they occupy. The rentals are claimed to be almost staggering and the patrons must pay them. Half the amounts paid for dishes represent rental, it was stated. This phase of the question will be investigated by the Commission.
