

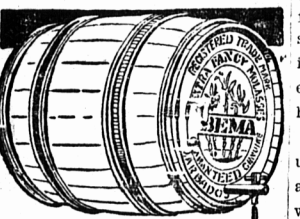

The London Sunday Express says

that in 1900 the consumption of spirits in England was 32,239,522 gallons. In 1913 it was 22,004,433 gallons. Today it has fallen to 10,412,921, and is growing less.

In France, also, where wine is as common as water, there has been a remarkable falling off in liquor consumption, while in Germany, where beer was the national drink, there has been a similar falling off since pre-war days.

In these countries, it will be noted, there has been no Prohibition at work, and the improvement is the result of a natural tendency everywhere apparent towards temperance.

In our own Province, with coercive laws that are not enforced, with a prescribed penalty of two hundred dollars for consuming liquor contrary to the law, and, for a second similar offence, of six months imprisonment without the option of a fine, the arrests and convictions for drunkenness are steadily increasing.

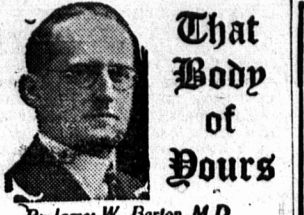

That Body of Yours

LIGHT IS FOOD I have spoken before about my wonder as a youngster that any human being should worship the sun, and how as I grew older, my wonder grew that more folks did not worship the sun.

Because as A. G. Nichols says "The sun is the most striking and splendid single object in Nature. It is the source of light and heat; it is the dispenser of health and happiness; it is the giver of life itself. All will admit that the sun is essential to the welfare and continued existence of all living creatures, whether animals or plants."

When the war ended, fats, in the form of cod liver oil, was given to the children of Vienna and other stricken cities, and then a strange thing was noticed.

That is, that while this supply of fats or cod liver oil was essential in the winter months, that it became less necessary as the warm weather advanced.

In other words, sunlight was equal to cod liver oil from the health standpoint, or in other words, light is food.

Then Dr. Huldehinsky of Berlin, made the remarkable discovery that if instead of giving cod liver oil to a child affected with rickets, he gave it a bath in the light from a quartz-mercury vapor lamp, recovery took place.

Now just as the sun can do much harm if common sense is not used, even more can these rays from these lamps do damage, because the profession itself is only learning something of their good and harmful properties.

Cleaning Leather

BRITISH HIGH COMMISSIONER IN CANADA
