

# YESTERDAY'S STOCK AND BOND QUOTATIONS

## Morning Stock Gossip

MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—With the New York market closed today, election day was not surprising that the Wall Street market yesterday was more buoyant. The strength was attributable to covering by "shorts" who desired to get out of the market over the holiday period. When the buying from this source was satisfied, the list again turned dull and eased off from the high points. The local market was extremely quiet with few changes of any note in evidence. Imperial Oil was a strong feature on the local curb.

There is a large Canadian interest in "rumor" Public since that company has been Canadian. Famous Players and as a result it is interesting to observe that foreign business of Paramount is expanding steadily as is indicated in increased revenues, also to be fact that foreign film rentals in the current year are 20 per cent above the rate in 1933. Another factor of importance from the standpoint of earnings is the growing popularity of the company's pictures, especially in Europe and France. Net income for the first nine months of the current year established a new high record and present indications are that full year result will mark a new record in annual earnings.

The substantial advance in Imperial yesterday was not surprising in view of the fact that the extra dividend announcement of 20 cents was much larger than had been expected. The act that the company will disburse \$1,000,000, thus placing the issue on a yield basis of between 5 and 6 per cent was bound to bring in considerable investment demand as the current yield is the highest in years.

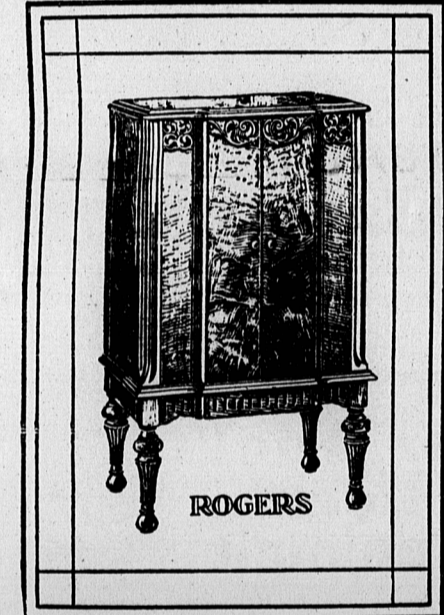

A bountiful lunch was then served by the ladies and a very pleasant social hour was enjoyed by all.

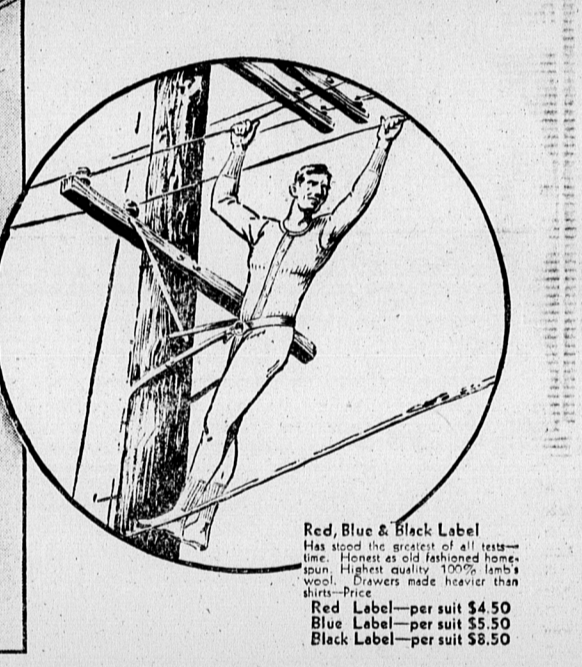
