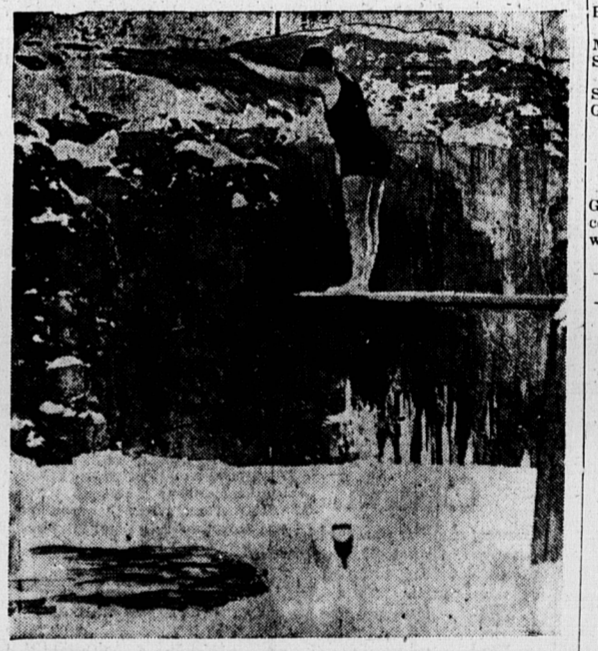
Roy D. Schooley, On Behalf of U. S. Hockey Association Congratulates Canucks
