Bruins Gain A Victory And Draw With Lowly Canadiens Over Weekend

BOSTON, Jan. 25—(CP)—With young Nick Damore of the Hershey American Hockey League Bears guarding their net, Boston Bruins overcame Montreal Canadiens 7-3 tonight in a National Hockey League contest that attracted 10,300 fans at Boston Garden.
Damore, filling in for Frankie Brimsek, who suffered a fractured nose in Montreal last night, kept Les Canadiens scoreless for more than 37 minutes, when the aggressive Kenny Reardon rushed and set up scoring chances that were cashed by Toe Blake and Johnny Quilly.
The visitors, however, became deeply bogged early in the third period when Reardon drew a major penalty for board checking Des Smith. The latter suffered a gash on his forehead that required three stitches. When Reardon was waved off, he hurried his stick the length of the rink, ripped off his gloves and slammed them to the ice. That outburst drew him a 10-minute misconduct sentence.
The Bruins launched a goal barrage in the opening session, with Frank Mario, also up from Hershey to take over centre Bill Cowley's duties, starting the scoring. It was Mario's first appearance on Boston ice and he scored on his first rush, after recovering the puck from Red Goupille deep in the Montreal zone.
Thereafter Flash Hollett countered twice and Smith, Dutch Hiller, Harvey Jackson and Roy Conacher each drove pucks through goalie Paul Bibeault, Hollett's second goal, as well as Conacher's came when Reardon was serving his major.
Canadiens third goal was the result of a breakaway staged by Buddy O'Connor, who fired in a 30-footer after beating the Bruins back to their zone.

MONTREAL, Jan. 25—(CP)—Boston's champion Bruins who in previous games this season found Canadiens a pretty easy mark behind New York Rangers who swept aside Detroit on another league front last night.
Playing before a crowd of 10,487, Canadiens looked anything but like a cellar-finish club as they came from behind an early two-goal Boston lead to square the issue, then play the Hub team off its feet.
Goalie Frankie Brimsek who was sensational in holding the Habitués to a pair of goals suffered a broken nose in the overtime session when several players piled up in his cage. He returned to play after treatment.
Manager Art Ross said he would try and obtain Paul Gauthier, backup goalie of Washington in the American Hockey League, to replace Brimsek for tonight's return game with Canadiens at Boston.
The Kraut line of Bobby Bauer, Milt Schmidt and Woody Dumart, who appeared in what is expected to be their last game here this season before entering the Canadian Army, played an outstanding game and figured in both Boston goals.
Little Bobby Bauer set up the pass for the opening marker when he sent Dix Clapper in from the right boards and the defenceman whipped a high shot past goalie Paul Bibeault. Then at 13:55 of the first period, Dumart put Boston two up when he tallied on Schmidt's glove in pass.
Murph Chamberlain got the first Canadien goal towards the close of the opening session on a combination attack with Emile Branchard and Toe Blake. Ray Gelliffe counted the equalizer midway through the second period when his shot from 40 feet out beat Brimsek to the top left hand corner of the net. Charlie Sands assisted on the play.

Rangers Crush Red Wings 11-2 To Sweep Week-end Series; Won Saturday 3-2

NEW YORK, Jan. 25—(CP)—New York Rangers, in their first home appearance since capturing the National Hockey League leadership on the road, gave a convincing display of scoring power tonight in defeating Detroit Red Wings 11-2 before 14,789 fans at Madison Square Garden.
In running up the highest score any team has made this season the Rangers kept their single-point margin over the second-place Boston Bruins. It was the second victory in two nights for the New Yorkers over Detroit, and again the lightweight line of Clint Smith, Grant Warwick and Alan Kuntz played a major part.
Warwick, who the Rangers are boosting for the rookie of the year award, got three goals and an assist, while Smith got a goal and three assists and Kuntz a goal and two assists.
The Rangers, who held a lead of nine goals before Detroit covered all, tried hard to give their young goalie, Jim Henry, his first shut-out. But Don Grosso pierced the New York defence while Alf Pike was serving a third-period holding penalty, taking on an unassisted rush, and two minutes before the end of the game Mud Bruneteau got Detroit's other counter on a play with Adam Brown and Syd Howe.
In taking the worst defeat in Red Wings' history, Jack Adams' club fell apart defensively in the second period, when the Rangers scored six goals, three of them in 48 seconds. Adams had sought to strengthen his defence by bringing up Eddie Bush from Providence Reds, giving the American League team defencemen Bob Whitelaw and Buck Jones for him.
But the husky newcomer was no more to blame for the defeat than the others of a usually-tight defence which on tonight's play could give goalie Johnny Mowers little protection.
