British Davis Cup Team Hopeful Of Defeating France

Are All Primed Up After Week's Rest—France Relies On Cochet For Seventh Straight Win.

PARIS, July 27—(A.P.)—The British Davis Cup team, victors over the United States in the interzone final, tonight was primed to break the six year reign of France over International tennis in the challenge round opening tomorrow on the red court of Roland Garros stadium.

OPENS PLAY

The French youngster, Andre Merlin, named to the team for the first time, will open the defence tomorrow against Austin, with Cochet and Perry following them on the courts.

The doubles will follow on Saturday with Jean Borotra and Jacques Brugnon playing for France, probably against Perry and Hughes, although the English doubles pair has not been definitely selected.

ARE CONFIDENT

The British, finalists against the French two years ago, believe they have the ability this time to break through the thin French line which has held against the world since 1927.

They have an experienced team in Fred Perry, H. W. (Bunny) Austin, George Patrick Hughes and H. G. N. Lee, reserve player. They doubt that Henri Cochet, main reliance of the French can defeat both Perry and Austin, even con-

NEW YORK, July 27—(A.P.)—For the second time in her glamorous international tennis career Helen Wills Moody today was selected to lead the United States Wightman cup team against the United Kingdom at Forest Hills, Aug. 4-5.
