Mr. George Richards, Alberly Plains has had the telephone installed recently.

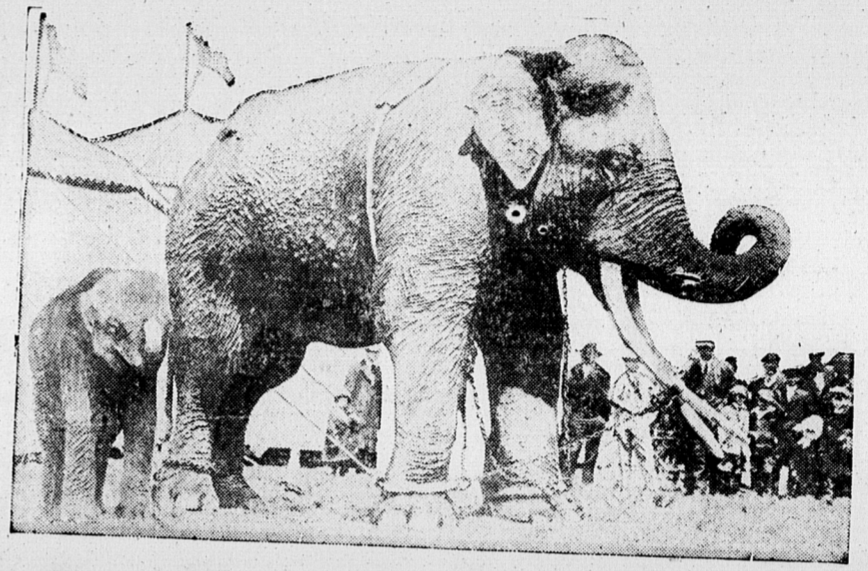

Of Air Mail

(Special to The Guardian)
OTTAWA, Ont., July 9.—Over 100 mail hours were saved to Canadian business men last week end. The air mail, which went overseas by catching the liner at Rimouski, totalling about 60,000 letters and instead of one aeroplane two machines had to be utilized to get the mail from Montreal. Practically all this last mail which caught the ship at Rimouski, came from Toronto and the West. The ship sailed from Montreal at 4 a. m. Sunday and at midnight the airmail aeroplanes caught up at Rimouski with mail which had arrived at Montreal between dawn and 3 p. m. on Sunday. This meant a saving of three to four days of sixty thousand dollars.
