CLOSING COTTON LETTER.

(F. B. McCurdy & Co's. Private Wire.)

NEW YORK—Probably a large number of people who have bought cotton preceding the census had planned to take profits following the issuance of the figures, but in addition to selling of this sort the figures proving a little larger than had been looked for, were followed by general realizing and a renewal of bear pressure as a result of which prices broke about 18 to 22 with subsequent fluctuations very nervous and irregular. It is true that the reports of the seasons indicate that ginning for the time between October 18 and November 1st ranges from about 14 to 15.4 per cent of the crop, and it is by applying these percentages to the number of bales ginned during the period that this year that the bearish deductions from the census figures are drawn. It must be very apparent, however, that there is a variation in the percentage of the total crop ginned from October 18th to November 1st than has happened to occur during previous seasons and the fact remains that the total ginning to November 1st, this year has been less than 5 per cent greater than last season whereas the view of the crop on which the market was based prior to the census report admits of an excess ginning, as compared with last year or nearly 10 per cent. Naturally if this crop is to be larger than that of last year ginning must exceed last years during some of the periods and if the ginning for the period between November 1st and November 14th does not run further ahead of last year than that of the last period we hardly see what there would be to substantiate the 11,500,000 bale estimates to say nothing of bigger figures.

CLOSING STOCK LETTER.

NEW YORK—Randolph says: The opening was active and irregular, stocks were for sale in quantities by people who seemed to be anxious to take profits on an election which was generally felt as favorable as had been anticipated. Before half an hour had elapsed it became evident that the market was a distinct disappointment to the bulls. On every advance stocks were freely supplied and the tone as a rule had begun to grow heavy. This heaviness increased as the day wore on and in the afternoon positive weakness developed. Stocks were pushed for sale steadily all day with the result that active issues like Union Pacific, Steel and Reading declined over three points from their early high level. There was absolutely no news to account for the decline which seemed to come simply from free liquidation on the announcement of what the Street termed the good news of Mr. Roosevelt's political death. The lowest prices of the day were registered in the last fifteen minutes of trading and the market continued active and weak with the lowest prices of the day recorded just before the close.
