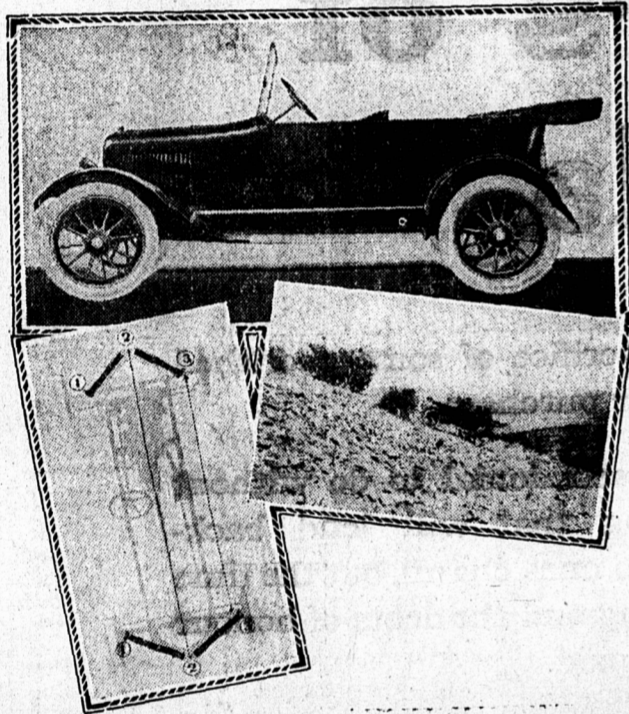

Above is shown the new, made-in-Canada Overland 4. It is being manufactured at Toronto by Willys-Overland Limited, who announce that production on a quantity basis has now been reached.

The chassis is illustrated along with the finished touring car model because of its radical departure in spring suspension. It will be seen from the drawing that the "springbase" exceeds the wheelbase by 30 inches. This exclusive "three-point" principle is the basis of the manufacturers' claim that the springs of Overland 4 give it a riding comfort hitherto not realized in a light car of the economical short wheelbase.

Speech By the Prince of Wales

MONTREAL, Oct. 31.—At the luncheon given in his honor, yesterday, H. R. H. the Prince of Wales commenced and finished his speech in reply in French and the remainder was given in English.

He said: Mr. Mayor, I am happy to be able to return to Montreal and I thank you for your generous hospitality in entertaining me to a second luncheon. I was particularly touched, Mr. Mayor, with one passage of the address in which you welcomed me yesterday.

The passage when you referred to the fast-speaking and French-speaking sections of the Canadian nation. (Applause.)

That is a matter that I had very much at heart (applause). I had it very much at heart when I landed, but having traversed the great Dominion from coast to coast I have it, if possible, more at heart now than ever before. (Applause.)

The union of the two races in Canada was never a matter of mere political convenience. On the contrary it was and will ever remain an example of the highest political wisdom, for which the Empire owes an inestimable debt to Cartier, to Macdonald, and to other great statesmen of both races who brought this union about. (Applause.)

Much has been written and said about the successful way that the British Empire has established political unions between races of different language and different history. The unions in Canadian South Africa are only later examples of the political union between England and Scotland and that brought Great Britain itself into existence as a political unity.

Before that, England and Scotland had been constantly and bitterly at war, but since that time they have become so closely united that we have forgotten that they were ever separated peoples.

The union between England and Scotland has lasted through centuries. The union between British and French races in Canada has only lasted half a century, but who can doubt that the union in Canada will produce as great a powerful and as united a nation as the British nation itself. (Applause.)

"None can read Canadian history, much less traverse the Dominion as I have for the last four months without realizing that the spirit and genius of both races is closely interwoven throughout the Dominion, and not only in the east, but in the west do both races share the honors of early exploration and early settlement."

But what is the secret of the success of British policy in this respect? I can say that the secret in Canada is the same as it is in Great Britain. It lies in freedom of speech, freedom of language and mutual respect for each other. (Loud cheers the audience rising to their feet and waving napkins and cheering enthusiastically.)
