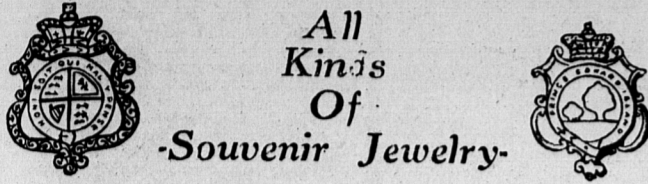

His Lordship Clare L. Worrell, Bishop of the Diocese of Nova Scotia and P. E. Island when in Sydney recently expressed himself as desirous of seeing accomplished the union of the church of England with other protestant churches. Speaking of the problem of church work in Nova Scotia, he referred to the present divisions of Protestant bodies producing an unprofitable repetition of work. "If only we were together with the Methodists, the Baptists, the Presbyterians, and the others. The church of England will certainly be a party to such a union before many years," said Bishop Worrell. "In fact we were the first church in Canada to propose a basis of union. We submitted a proposal 25 years ago, but the others would not accept it then." Asked if he thought the church of England was at all likely to go into a union project at the present time, or as soon as the Presbyterians and Methodists, Bishop Worrell said he did not think it possible. "It will certainly be so later, however," he said. The Bishop admitted that the other churches meeting union thought the Anglicans the most distant of all. "Still," he said, "they will find us as charitable as any of them. We have traditions to which we cling, but it will be found that we can give as well as we can take."
