THE ISLAND 140 YEARS AGO.

Much information respecting the soil, forest, capabilities, population, &c., of the different sections of this Province is embodied in the report of survey made by Major Holland in July, 1767, one hundred and forty years ago. The following is an abstract of this report:

Lot 1.—Lands and wood bad, mostly nothing but small spruce; no land cleared; no houses; coast steep and rugged, 40 to 70 feet high; several fresh water ponds and rivers; cod-fishery to the east exceeding good.

Lot 2.—Lands and woods as above; no cleared land or houses; coast and fishery as above.

Lot 3.—Woods and soil as above; no cleared land or houses; coast and fishery as above.

Lot 4.—Woods and soil are better than above; no clearings or houses; coast to east is marshy and low; woods to west of Monckton Cove tolerably good.

Lot 5.—Woods and soil pretty good; no clearings or houses; this township is very good, having a fine harbor and good fishing; woods and lands finely watered.

Lot 6.—Woods and soil very good; 4 houses; 50 acres cleared; this township good but not equal to No. 5. Only small craft can come up Foxley River; the cleared land makes it nearly equal.

Lot 7.—Woods and soil indifferent; no houses or clearings; this township is bad; no fishery; sea coast steep and rocky.

Lot 8.—Woods and lands to the south are good; no houses or clearings; this township good for agriculture; marshes at Wolfe Inlet will make fine meadows.

Lot 9.—Woods and lands good; no houses or clearings; lands on the south marshy and fit for meadows at Sandy Cove.

Lot 10.—Good woods and lands, fit for meadows and tillage, but marshy along Perivall and Enmore Rivers; no houses or clearings.

Lot 11.—Lands and woods good; no houses or clearings; marshes along Cavendish Channel can make fine meadows, but channel is only navigable for canoes.

Lot 12.—Lands and woods as above; no houses or clearings; well situated for fishery and lands fine for agriculture shallows could come up Wood River.

Lot 13.—Land and woods very good; 1 church, 24 houses and barns, 750 acres cleared; this is one of the best townships on the island both for situation and fishery and for cleared land.

Lot 14.—Lands and woods very good 12 houses and barns, 350 acres cleared; this township has fine land; Ellis River is navigable for ships of any burthen.

Lot 15.—Woods and land indifferently good; 10 acres cleared; has a good extent along the sea, advantageous for agriculture.

Lot 16.—Land and woods good; no cleared land or houses; having the advantage of Ellis River and Richmond Bay may turn out to advantage for fishery and agriculture.

Lot 17.—No clearings or houses; woods and lands good; being situated on the neck between Richmond and Halifax Bays, with good lands on both sides must turn to advantage.

Lot 18.—Good woods and lands, no clearings or houses; surrounds the county town, and convenient for fishery, must turn out to advantage.

Lot 19.—Good lands and woods; 2 houses, 1 sawmill, 20 acres cleared; has water communication with Halifax and Richmond Bays and the carrying place by land is a good road, makes it of value.

Lot 20.—Indifferent woods and soil, no houses or clearings; of little value till neighboring townships are settled.

Lot 21.—Lands and woods better than the former, no houses or cleared land; well situated for fishery; but Grenville Bay is only fit for small craft.

Lot 22.—Lands and woods something better than the former; no clearing or houses; has same advantages as the former.

Lot 23.—Woods and lands very good above Hunter River; no houses or clearings; very good where Hunter River intersects with its smaller branches.

Lot 24.—Good lands and woods, some oak, a few winter cabins, 60 acres cleared; one of the best townships on the island for fishery or tillage. The woods will pay for clearing it.

Lot 25.—Very good lands and woods; 8 houses and barns, 225 acres cleared; one of the best lots for agriculture and has good water transport to Halifax Bay.

Lot 26.—Very good lands and woods; 10 houses, 500 acres cleared; good for agriculture and woods; has advantage of Dunk River and Halifax Bay.

Lot 27.—Lands and forest good; no clearings or houses; in time may be valuable for agriculture.

Lot 28.—Good wood and lands; 20 houses and barns, 450 acres cleared; good lands for agriculture; woods along the coast mostly spruce, and indifferent, but good farther inland; from Cape Traverse is the shortest cut to the Continent.

Lot 29.—Good woods and lands; 4 houses and barns, 100 acres cleared; is near as good as former, but not so much communication with the coast.

Lot 30.—Woods along the coast, spruce; lands and woods better up the country; none cleared, no houses; has steep sea coast with neither coves nor rivers.

Lot 31.—Good woods and soil; 7 houses, 200 acres cleared; well suited for agriculture; has short communication with the intended meadows by Elliot River; not convenient for fishing.

Lot 32.—Lands and woods same as 31; 7 houses, 150 acres cleared; has communication with the Chief Town by both York and Elliot Rivers.

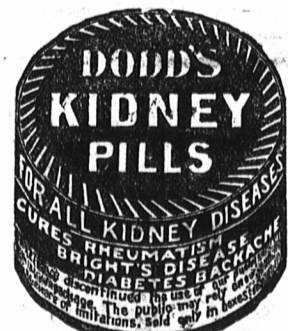
Lot 33.—Good woods, tolerably good soil; no cleared land or houses; good fishing on the North Shore and a safe harbor for shallops.

Lot 34.—Woods very good, extremely fertile soil, particularly on the north side; 10 houses, 300 acres cleared; pretty good place for fishing, but most advantageously situated for farming.
