Coalless Switzerland.

With a population of 3,000,000 Switzerland is without any coal supply of her own. None of her rivers is navigable, and all her coal imports have to be brought in by rail, which makes it very expensive. Her coal bill is about \$12,500,000 a year.

In order to make her outlay for fuel as economical as possible the government has decided to establish a federal testing station, attached to the leading institution for technical instruction at Zurich. At this station every kind of fuel used in the little republic is to be scientifically tested to determine its exact heat producing value, which will be made known to the public through periodical publications by the government. It is intended to reform the whole coal trade by substituting heat producing value for weight as the basis of its price per ton.

Our consul at Zurich, in reporting this scheme, states that its originator is an American, Dr. E. J. Constan, from New York, at present professor of chemistry in the Swiss Federal Polytechnic.

UNDER THE SULTAN.

The Way the Turkish Ruler Removes His Enemies.

Things get done in the sultan's rebus, things like the massacres of 1895 in Asiatic Turkey and of 1903 in Macedonia, which come home to the consciousness of every thinking Turk. Take the case of the Kurdish Sheik Obaidullah, who was a guest of the sultan for a time in 1883 and was afterwards sent to Mecca in order that pious occupations might keep him out of mischief. He died very soon after his arrival of cholera. It was officially announced, although he was the only sufferer from cholera in Mecca that year.

Take the case of Mithad Pasha, the liberal prime minister and the champion of parliamentary government. He was tried for treason in aiding to dethrone Sultan Abdul Aziz and was sent to Taif, near Mecca. After a time he died rather suddenly. By and by a man who had been a soldier in Arabia appeared in Constantinople babbling a tale that ended with, "I did not know that it was Mithad Pasha or I would not have put the soaped cord about his neck." Of course the police saw that the man was crazy and put him where he was safe from harm.

Take the case of Said Pasha, ex-grand vizier, who fled to the British embassy in Constantinople seven or eight years ago, declaring that he would be killed unless allowed asylum and who could not be induced to leave the building until the ambassador brought him a formal promise of safety sealed with the sultan's own seal.

Meditation upon this class of mysteries makes people shake in their shoes every time that they see one of the great army of paid informers who know everything. Men do not say that the sultan does the things which cause this trepidation, but that "the palace" does them. They speak of the "palace" as though it were a sentient but invisible organism, and when they speak of it they look behind them and take out their handkerchiefs and wipe a clammy sweat from their faces.

Historic Cape Cod.

A movement is on foot to mark the historic spots in which the old town of Barnstable, on Cape Cod, abounds. It has been stated that this town contains fully as much of historic interest as Plymouth, and there are many unmarked localities that have been identified with stirring events in the early days of the colonies. The first courthouse built in the county still stands at the head of Rendezvous lane, where the volunteers of the Revolution first assembled, although the building has been transformed into a church. In front of it is the little triangle where the liberty pole stood and where the troops were drilled. In this courthouse was sounded the first note of revolt against British rule, and it is proposed to place inscribed tablets on these spots and others equally interesting to commemorate and preserve the traditions connected with them.

A Hard Won Dinner.

Several days ago five or six sparrows were picking away in the gutter immediately in front of an engine house downtown when a cat crept across the street and pounced upon one of them. Instantly the victim's companions sent up a war cry, which was as instantly answered. From housetop and tree the sparrows flocked to the scene, and with whirring, hissing cries of noisy rage they fearlessly attacked the offender. For half a minute the dazed cat endured the blows from perhaps half a hundred tiny beaks and twice as many wings. Then, still holding her prey, she struggled away from the infuriated little birds and ran into the engine house. The plucky little fellows followed her inside, but soon gave up the chase, leaving her with her dearly bought dinner a sadder but a wiser cat.
