Former S'side Man Awarded Silver Star

The following news item appears in this week's edition of the Knights of Columbus Bulletin. It will be of great interest to the many friends in Summerside of Lt. Colonel Preston Murphy, formerly of this town who has been residing in Fort Collins since he moved away from his home town some years ago. Residents in Summerside had an opportunity last summer of renewing his acquaintance when he visited Summerville with his wife and family.

The Silver Star, for gallantry under fire, was awarded to Lt. Col. Preston J. C. Murphy, a former District Deputy of Colorado and a charter member and Past Grand Knight of Fort Collins Council No. 1214.

The Silver Star citation for Col. Murphy issued by General Troy H. Middleton, commander of the Forty-fifth Infantry division now fighting with the Fifth Army, reads:

"For gallantry in action on July 1943, northwest of Sicily. While his battalion was engaged in attacking an important ridge strongly held by the enemy, Lt. Col. Murphy made his way from his forward observation post, accompanied by two platoons of his division, to the summit of the ridge and while under continuous enemy fire, Lt. Col. Murphy directed the successful maneuver of his battalion. His prompt and courageous action, together with his personal safety, supplied the inspiration that caused his troops to assault the ridge and hold it against a strong enemy counter-attack. Lt. Col. Murphy's exemplary leadership, courage and devotion to duty reflect the high ideals of the military service."

It is possible that the citation may have been awarded to Col. Murphy for his part in the battle of Bloody Ridge in Sicily last July. In that historic battle he led his battalion in taking the ridge which repulsed German counterattacks.

(Continued from page 1.) SPEECH FROM THE THRONE

"Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island: I have pleasure in welcoming you to the first Session of the Forty-first General Assembly of Prince Edward Island.

"I have pleasure in welcoming you to the first Session of the Forty-first General Assembly of Prince Edward Island. Since I last addressed you a great improvement in the weather situation has taken place. Our enemies are now everywhere on the defensive and their territories are being invaded by the air, land and sea. Our Russian ally has recovered most of his lost territory and the weight of our resources is being felt in every theatre of war so much so that an early end to the world wide conflict is anticipated.

"Our Government intends to make a beginning in land survey in the Province and legislation with this end in view will be presented. I have pleasure in presenting a large extension to the Sanatorium with assistance from the Federal Government.

"Our Government notes the proposed measures by the Government of Canada to be passed at its Session before April 1st. We hope that the Health Insurance scheme may not be beyond your ability to finance and we hope that the plan for Family Allowances may prove to be an effective measure of social security.

"The use of electricity in our Province is only a very small fraction of its use elsewhere. My Government is anxious to increase the source of electricity may be found and exploited for the use of farmers and fishermen especially. An intensive study of electrical development will be made forthwith.

"The search for oil and gas has been a feature of the Session before April 1st. The location of a site for a testing borings are already made to a depth of 100 feet. "I leave you with the business of the Session with confidence in your integrity and ability to handle the affairs of the Province, and pray that Divine providence may guide you always."
