P. E. ISLAND WOMAN A VICTIM OF SUICIDE

Mrs. T. F. Bowe and George A. Gorton, Arrested on Husband's Charge, Drink Strychnine and Die Almost Together--The Details of a Deplorable Case.

ESSEX, Mass., June 13.—One of the most sensational affairs which has taken place in this town for years was the double suicide which took place here when George Alden Gorton, aged 59, and Mrs. Edith A. Bowe, both of Grove street, living within a half mile of each other, ended their lives by taking strychnine. Last Saturday morning Mr. Gorton and Mrs. Bowe were arrested charged with a statutory offence. The house was entered at 1 o'clock in the morning upon a complaint issued to the Essex police by T. F. Bowe, husband of Mrs. Bowe, who learned a few days ago that Mr. Gorton was visiting the house. It is said that Mr. Bowe travels on the road selling bitters of his own manufacture, and when away Mr. Gorton called at the house. It is also alleged that Mr. Bowe had planned a trip last Friday which was to be to Mr. Gorton, and thinking Mr. Bowe learning that he was entertaining company kept watch on the house, and seeing Gorton enter, called the police.

Gorton and Mrs. Bowe were taken to Gloucester and placed under arrest. Their case came before the court Tuesday morning and was held over to the grand jury both being held in \$400 bonds, which were furnished.

Gorton returned to his home and on his way went to a store in Essex and endeavored to buy poison, saying that he wished to kill a cow. It was refused and so he went to Gloucester and bought some strychnine, after which he returned home and drank it. He suffered terrible agony and died about 1 o'clock.

It was claimed that he stopped on the way and left some poison with Mrs. Bowe.

Within 24 hours of the time that Gorton ended his life, Mrs. Edith A. Bowe also died by the strychnine. It is said Mrs. Bowe received word that the bondsman had withdrawn the bonds after learning of the death of Gorton, and she feared to go to jail. She said that she would never be locked up and went into the house and took the poison. She was found in her room by Miss Cheney, who was stopping at the house, and Mr. Bowe.

It was stated that the mother gave her 7-year-old daughter Alice a drink of the strychnine and that she was in a serious condition, but later this was denied. As the story was told by Bowe to a Globe reporter the little child entered the bedroom and saw her mother dying on the floor. She fainted and it was some time before the child was brought to.

In speaking of the tragedy tonight Mr. Bowe said he had always done everything that he could for Edith. "I do not know how my wife became acquainted with Mr. Gorton, and on first hearing that he visited my house I took very little notice of it, but after hearing several times of his visits I investigated and had the police keep watch of his movements, which led to the arrest."

Mrs. Gorton was seen at her home tonight. She said that Mrs. Bowe called at the house several times after Mr. Gorton to go down to her house to see her, and when she did not come herself she would send a note by her daughter.

I begged my husband not to pay any attention to her and keep away from the house, but he would insist on going. He said that he was going to stick by her as she wanted to leave her husband.

George J. Gorton, son of George A. Gorton, was seen at his home, and stated that he had nothing to say about the affair, excepting that he knew that his father was visiting Mrs. Bowe, and that he did all in his power to stop him from going to the house.

Mrs. Bowe was born at Prince Edward Island, Nov. 8, 35 years ago, and was married to T. F. Bowe at Portland, N. H., April 15, 1898, and came to Essex June 18 of last year, where they have since resided. Mr. Bowe is 69 years of age.

George A. Gorton was born in Essex and always made it his home. He resided up to the time of his death. He was a farmer. He leaves a wife and one son.

CUTTING RATES TO WINNIPEG

Opening of New Line to Sudbury Reduces Distance

TORONTO, June 13.—There is talk here of another railway war between the C. P.R. and Grand Trunk, over the opening of the new line to Sudbury, by the C.P.R.

The new line reduces the distance to Winnipeg by several hundred miles and the C. P. R. has cut fares accordingly. The Grand Trunk has also reduced the fare to \$21, a cut of \$5.45, by way of Chicago.

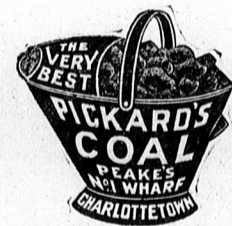
