Cafeteria Railroad Serves In Far North

NOME, Alaska, Dec. 8.—Sheer novelty of transportation is the claim to fame of the Pupmobile railroad between Nome and Sheldahl, for the trains are minus both locomotives and engineers.

The motive power is furnished by husky dogs and the railroad crew is composed of the passengers themselves. Operation of the train consists solely in welding a whip, except in cases where two trains meet between sidings. In that contingency, the one with the lighter load is lifted from the track while the other passes. Then the "engine" is hitched on again and the journey continues.

The railroad has 87 miles of narrow gauge track. It was built in the early days of Alaska mining to connect the Kougarok mining district with the coast, and was bought by the Territory three years ago. It is now operated by the Alaska road commission for the public use.

Vicar Talks Gospel Over Glass of Beer

LONDON, Dec. 8.—The Rev. A. W. Barker, vicar of St. Mary Magdalene, church, in a London working class district, believes in taking the church to the public house and talking conversion over a casual glass of beer. On this account he has become known as the "Publican's Bishop" of which title he is very proud.

"If my parishioners won't come to church, the only thing I can do is to take the church to them, which I do nearly every day in the year," says the vicar.
