In Memoriam

THOMAS C. WAKEFIELD

The death occurred in Dorchester, Mass., on September 11th of Thomas C. Wakefield, son of Joseph Wakefield and Margaret Condon Wakefield, former residents of Charlottetown, P.E.I. Mr. Wakefield spent his boyhood days in this City and will be kindly remembered by many early friends and school-mates of West Kent School which he attended while living here. Leaving Charlottetown in his youth, he went with his parents to reside in the United States. He revisited Charlottetown a few years ago and renewed many friendships.
Mr. Wakefield, who was held in high esteem by many friends in Dorchester and vicinity, fought with the American Navy during the Great War of 1914-1918.
He leaves to mourn his loss four sisters, Mrs. A. D. Evans, (Bessie) and Mrs. Edward Tellow, (Connie) with whom he made his home, also Mrs. Kimball, (Louise), and Frances besides a niece and nephew Mildred and Edward Tellow.
Mrs. Evans, who spends most of her summers in this City, only returned home to Dorchester about a week prior to her brother's death. Funeral services were held at the J. B. Cole Funeral Home, Dorchester, on Tuesday, September 14th.

BOUND UP ALLIED PRISONERS

AT THE SWISS FRONTIER, Sept. 17—(AP)—German authorities were reported today to be rounding up all Allied prisoners released in Italy after the capitulation of the Pietro Badoglio Government and to have ordered all Italian troops to report for duty in the German Army. (Some Canadians, chiefly airmen, have been reported from their next of kin.)

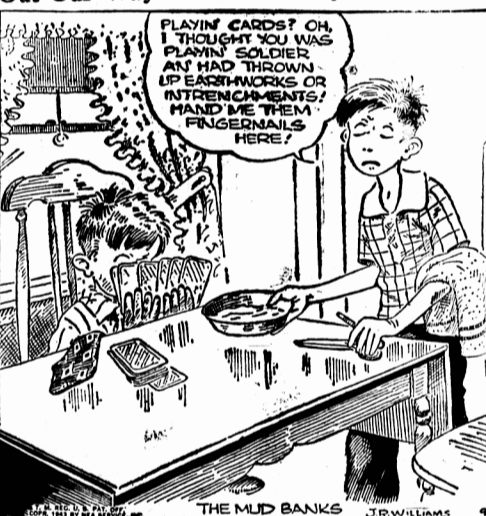

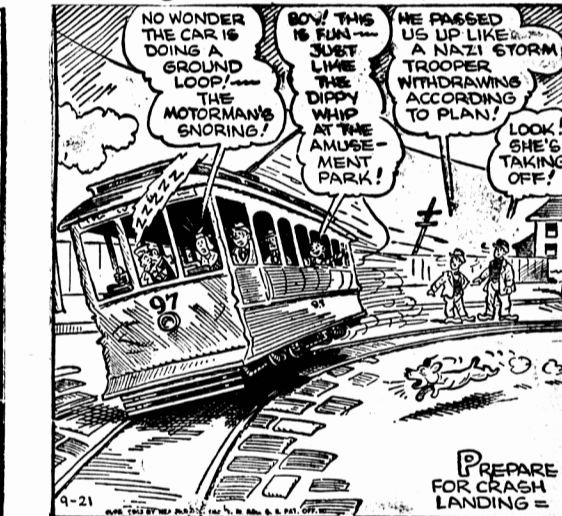

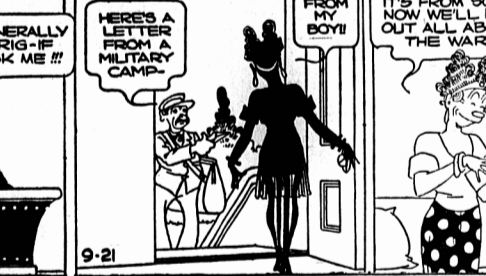
