Upland Game Birds Outlook Encouraging

Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported last night that the outlook for Ring-necked pheasant and Hungarian partridge for the coming fall season is decidedly bright in several districts south of the Hillsboro River that have been checked closely.

Ring-necked pheasants are showing the show in some districts. Many of these beautiful birds are to be found on a single farm within a few miles of Charlottetown. The Hungarian partridge are taking good place in numbers in the specific districts checked by Game Officials but a number of pheasants have been observed. It is too early to make any definite statement on the pheasant as it is difficult to route the birds out until after the grain is in, but the check to date shows that the Hungarian are more numerous in southern parts of the King's counties.
