The Dominion Government which proclaimed Thanksgiving on the 31st of this month, is now at work trying to save the holiday from disappointment by reason of the extinction of the necessary Thanksgiving turkey. Dr. Charles Higgins, Dominion biologist, states that the high price of turkeys is not the result of a combine, but is due to a great mortality among turkeys all over Canada, caused by parasitic and contagious disease commonly known as "blackhead." The disease which manifested itself by black spots on the comb, is raging throughout the Dominion. The only efficient remedy so far discovered is to starve the bird for 48 hours and then administer diluted solution of muriatic acid, a teaspoonful of acid to a quart of water. Dr. Higgins, however, is at work upon some plan by which the disease may be stamped out or contagion prevented. The disease is reported from every province of the Dominion.—Ex.

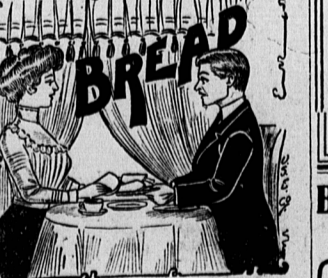
The members and friends of the Salvation Army here will read the following from a St. John exchange with interest:—A special London cable recently indicated that Commissionaire Coombs, head of the Salvation Army in Canada, had resigned, owing to differences of opinion with the central authorities. The cable was as follows: "International headquarters of the Salvation Army has been criticized on account of the recent resignation of superior officers, especially Commissionaire Coombs. It is freely stated that he left because the central authorities were developing a policy opposed to Canadian aspirations." The list of more recent resignations published includes Colonel Thomas Howell, emigration commissioner. It is said some of these officers will inaugurate a vigorous scheme to promote emigration to Canada apart from the Salvation Army." Brigadier Adby stated that he had received a wire from the commissioner yesterday afternoon in which he said the report that had come over the water was absolutely false. The commissioner had not resigned because of any immigration difficulties or from any other reason, but was still occupying his position.
