AN AGRICULTURAL COURSE

Sir, William McDonald Will Endow It—Prof. Robertson Handling the Matter.

Through the generosity of Sir William MacDonald a system of practical instruction is about to be introduced in the rural schools of Canada which will form quite as important an adjunct to the education of the rural youth as manual training is now acknowledged to be in the instruction of pupils in the schools in towns and cities.

Prof. J. W. Robertson, commissioner of dairying and agriculture, to whom Sir William entrusted his splendid gift of \$150,000 for the establishment and maintenance of the manual training system, has just returned from a mission to Washington which ensures the co-operation of the ablest specialists of the United States in laying a solid foundation for this educational scheme for rural schools.

Prof. Robertson had a series of conferences in Washington with Hon. James Wilson, secretary of agriculture in President Roosevelt's cabinet, in regard to what could be done to improve education in rural schools so as to render farm life more enjoyable to boys and girls in the country, Sir William MacDonald having accepted the plan for improvement in country school education, which was substantially the same as presented to the Dominion Educational Association here last summer.

A Large Tramp Steamer.

Fresh from the hands of her English builders, the Workfield, one of the largest of recently constructed steamships of the tramp type, reached New York Sunday on her maiden trip from Middlesbrough, Eng. Her length is 372 feet, beam 48 feet and dead weight capacity 9,500 tons. She will load for Australia.
