**De Valera Given Chance To Run In Election**

(Associated Press)

DUBLIN, Nov. 12.—A determination to employ "peaceful penetration" to break down the border between Ulster and the Irish Free State was believed here tonight to be behind a reported invitation to President De Valera to be a candidate in the Northern Ireland Parliamentary elections Nov. 30.

A conference of Republicans from the "six counties"—Ulster—was said to have made the invitation to the Irish Free State Executive.

President De Valera said in an interview that he had nothing to add to the statement he made Thursday before the convention of his party, the Fianna Fail, that it was not his will that he ceased to be a representative of the people of Northern Ireland and that if they wished him to represent them he was ready.
