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New O'Leary Power Line Accepted By Provincial Gov't.

Designed to serve the residents of O'Leary and surrounding districts, the recently constructed 1 1/2 mile long power line from Mr. Pleasant O'Leary to the Provincial Government is a brief ceremony at O'Leary Tuesday.

With the completion of the new power line, the residents in the West Prince centre are now able to receive a supply of power from the Summerside Electric Light plant.

In a brief address, on the occasion of the taking over of the line Mr. Barbour expressed appreciation to the Maritime Electric Company, who constructed the line and was highly complimentary in regard to the high standard of the work.

On hand for the ceremony were V.A. Ainsworth, General Manager of the Maritime Electric Company, and A. G. Ley, Distribution Superintendent for the Company. On arrival Mr. Ainsworth and Mr. Ley were greeted by Mr. Barbour and Gordon White, his Deputy Minister.

Crew Foreman for the Maritime Electric, Winston MacKay tested the line and Messrs Barbour and White conducted an inspection before taking it over on behalf of the Provincial Government.

Construction of the line got underway April 14 and two months ago Mr. Ley Construction crews varied in number from seven to twenty-five and as much local labor was employed as possible.

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Cabot Coin For Newfoundland's Entry

OTTAWA, June 16 — (CP) — John Cabot's 1467 ship will sail on silver waves if the design for a new silver coin to commemorate Newfoundland's entry into Confederation is approved by the government.

Royal Canadian mint craftsmen, it was learned today, have completed a design for the coin which depicts the sailing ship on one side and the profile of the King on the other.

The cabinet is expected to take the design under consideration which reached Newfoundland 452 years ago are the Latin words "Floreat Terra Nova" — may the new land flourish. Cabot's ship also appears on the green four-cent stamp issued by the Post Office Department last April in honor of Canada's 10th province.
