**METHODIST DISTRICT MEETING.**  
The financial meeting of the Charlotte-town District was held Wednesday in Grace Church, Rev. S. H. Rice in the chair. The members present were Rev. W. B. Thomas, J. Perkins, Thos. Hicks, R. Opie, A. D. McCully, Wm. Wass and J. W. McConnell, S. F. Drake and J. Boundy. After devotional exercises the amounts collected for the General Conference Fund were paid and consideration given to assessments for Supernumerary Fund. The greater part of the morning session was given up to the consideration of the mission circuits in the District. Grants were recommended to the Winsloe, Vernon River, Souris, Montague and Mt. Stewart missions. The following ministers were appointed to attend meetings in the interest of the Missionary Society: Rev. S. H. Rice and Rev. E. Bell, at Cornwall; Rev. R. Opie and Rev. J. W. McConnell, at York; Revs. Bell, Hicks, Wass and Rice at Winsloe; Revs. McConnell and Young at Pownal; Revs. Thomas and Parkins at Vernon River; Rev. E. Bell, Murray Hbr.; Revs. McConnell and Bell at Mt. Stewart. Educational Fund meetings on some of the circuits were arranged. Rev. G. M. Young is to represent the Educational Society at Pownal; Rev. J. W. McConnell at Souris and Murray Bay Harbour. A committee consisting of Revs. S. H. Rice and J. W. McConnell were appointed to arrange for the coming of Rev. Dr. Borden, Principal of Ladies College, Sackville, and Rev. Jabez Rogers, of Fredericton, N. B. in the interest of Educational Society. A communication was read from E. R. MacKenzie of St. John, respecting S. S. matters in the district. This was followed by a profitable discussion on S. S. matters. A communication was read from Dr. Paisley, Conference Treasurer of St. James Church Fund. The circular showed that the District had \$150.00 yet to raise in order to come up to the amount indicated by the committee having the relief of the church in hand. The feeling of the District was decidedly in favour of doing every thing possible for the church and a com. made up of Rev. S. H. Rice and Rev. J. W. McConnell was appointed to communicate with Rev. Dr. Graham, of Montreal, and to arrange a scale by which any amount unpaid by the District might be met. A gratifying report of the 20th Century Thanksgiving Fund was read from Rev. Dr. Potts, of Toronto. It showed the fund to be largely in excess of the million dollars and the Treasurer urged the immediate payment of any balances yet outstanding. The evening meeting was one of great interest and profit. The chairman of the District occupied the chair, Rev. W. W. Lodge, of Hampton, N. B., led in prayer. The speakers of the evening, Rev. W. B. Thomas, of Cornwall, Rev. E. Bell, of Souris and Geo. Irving, of Vernon River, delivered earnest and eloquent addresses.
