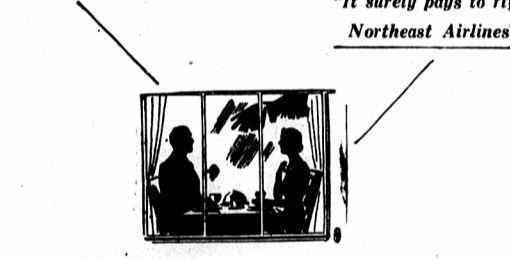

Forestry Corps For Civilian Employment

OTTAWA, Dec. 14 — (CP)— The overseas woods operations of the Canadian Forestry Corps recently curtailed a reduction in the strength of the corps is indicated by an announcement from Defence Headquarters today.

The announcement said Forestry Corps soldiers recently brought back to Canada who wish to return overseas may, if of suitable age and medical category, transfer to another arm of the service, enter the reinforcement stream and do so.

When a part of the Forestry Corps establishment was returned from overseas it was stated that it was considered they could be employed more usefully in cutting timber in Canada than in Scotland.

The men returned were then offered six months' leave without pay to accept civilian employment in forestry work.

Reports from Alberta said some Forestry Corps soldiers who were stationed at Camrose, Alta., were unwilling to accept leave on the terms offered, that they preferred to remain in the army on army pay and allowances and with the protection afforded by the army in the way of pensions and other rights rather than accept leave to earn the going wages offered civilians.

Stock Markets At A Glance

MONTREAL, Dec. 16 — (CP)— A last-hour rally by alcohols and newsprint gave Stock Exchange and Curb Market trading a firm closing tone today.

TORONTO, Dec. 16 — (CP)— The gold stocks suffered from mild selling pressure today on the Toronto Exchange and the group closed .50 down in the index. Base metals recorded small index gains and the western oils finished the day unchanged. Volume was well up that of Wednesday at 305,000 shares.

NEW YORK, Dec. 16 — (CP)— Liquor stocks went on another climb spree in today's market and while rails and many leaders faltered to timbers, motors, rubbers and scattered blue chip industrials pushed up after considerable early hesitancy.

The Associated Press 60-stock average managed to emerge with a net gain of 1.1 of a point at 46. Transfers totalled 761,430 shares compared with 664,130 the day before.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 16 — (CP)— Easier Chicago prices, heavier grain inspections and the Canadian wheat board's announcement of a general increase of 10 bushels a seeded acre in delivery quotas in Manitoba all worked to bring wheat futures into lower ground today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.

Closing premiums were 1 to 1.2 cent lower with December at \$1.10-1.2, May \$1.21 1-8 and July \$1.19-5-8.

CHICAGO, Dec. 16 — (AP)— With commercial interests almost entirely out of the market, wheat prices slumped today. Activity was restricted, but losses ran to about a cent at one time. Rise declined on selling by eastern commission houses and oats and barley were weak.

LONDON, Dec. 16 — (CP)— The Stock Market generally closed lower or coincident with reports of Prime Minister Churchill's illness.

Industrials mostly were easier with tobacco shares reacting after a firm opening oils reactionary, kaffirs and diamonds lower and home rails quiet. International securities declined.

ARTIST KILLED IN CRASH

NEW DELHI, Dec. 15 — (CP)— Lucien Adolph Labaudt, 65, Life Magazine artist of San Francisco, Calif., was among 12 persons killed in an American plane crash in Assam near the Burma border Sunday.

Labaudt was the first war correspondent killed in this theatre.

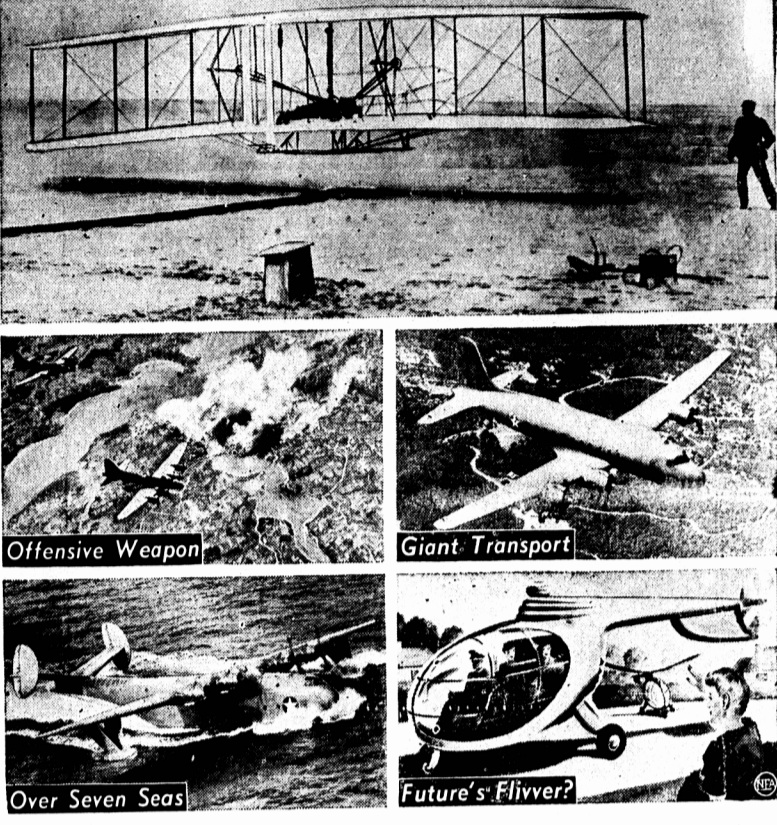

Forty Years of Flight



Forty years ago, Dec. 17, 1903, on the wind-swept dunes of Kitty Hawk, N. C., man's age-old dream of flight in a heavier-than-air machine came true when Wilbur Wright, prone on the lower wing of what amounted to a motorized kite, took off and flew 852 feet in 59 seconds. Actually it was the first flight of the Dayton, O., brothers, but it was the longest and proved the practicality of aerial voyages for Dr. and Mrs. Orville Wright. The historic flight is pictured at top above, with brother Orville watching. Photos below symbolize the development of the airplane in the short span of two-score years — as a mighty factor in winning the war for the United Nations; as a swift carrier of men and materials to the earth's far corners, with the promise of globe-girdling; as a means of regular peace-keeping service; and a preview of the helicopter—hailed by its enthusiasts as the family "flier" of the future.
