THE DREAD DISEASE

10,000 Cases of Consumption in Ontario

A SUITABLE SANITORIA

In a Central Location to Meet the Needs of the Province Advocated.

TORONTO, Sept. 8.—The Ontario Association for the prevention of Consumption met in the city hall, the President, Dr. Thorburn, in the chair. Owing to the attractions of the Exhibition and other causes there was only a small attendance, and it was therefore decided to confine the proceedings to routine business. The President in his opening remarks pointed out that the association was Provincial, and not local in its character, and therefore deserved the approval and financial assistance which the Ontario Government has promised. In expatiating upon the importance of the movement promoted by the association he referred to the ravages of the disease of consumption, and said public and medical opinion had changed as to the possibility of practically stamping it out since the discovery of the bacillus. There was a more hopeful feeling now that the disease could be stamped out like small-pox. Consumption carried away its tens of thousands. In fact it was stated by the Board of Health that in Ontario alone there were ten thousand cases of consumption. This meant a terrible loss to the community, and a danger to the country. He went on to say that the inaugural meeting of the association had been held early in June and a constitution had been adopted, and a provisional board of officers elected. He proposed that the meeting should confirm the constitution and sanction the list of officers as originally elected.

The draft constitution was then submitted and formally adopted. It defines the objects of the association as follows:—The collection and dissemination of information as to the contagious character of tuberculosis, and as to the methods and measures necessary for public protection; the education of public opinion and the stimulation of individual and collective initiative with regard to the means of preventing the spread of tuberculosis; the enlightenment of the public as to the necessity of the enactment and strict enforcement of sanitary laws as a method of prevention and cure of tuberculosis; the dissemination of information with respect to the contagion in food supplies, especially in the milk of tuberculous cattle, and the means of preventing the same; to encourage the erection and support of sanatoria in suitable locations, and to such an extent as to meet the needs of the Province; to encourage such co-operation of Governments, municipalities, philanthropic organizations and of individuals as shall provide sanatoria for the people on the lines made possible by Ontario legislation. The fee for ordinary members was placed at \$1. Provision was made for the formation of branch associations, on condition that they transmit to the Treasurer one-fifth of the sums received as membership fees.

The list of officers was then agreed upon as follows:—Hon. President, His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Oliver Mowat, G.C.M.G.; President, Dr. James Thorburn; Corresponding Secretary, Peter H. Bryce, M. D.
