HARROW, Middlesex, England (CP) — Because of the growing number of elderly patients, Central Middlesex Group of Hospitals is to consider appointment of a doctor whose sole job would be the care of aged sick.

Davie Kirkwood was born in a poor section of Glasgow, in a two-room apartment that had no lavatory and no water. But his early recollections are of his fierce pride in his forebears — "eight generations Glasgow-born on one side, five on the other" — and of his craft as an engineer.

The "real knockout blow" of his life came in 1915. As chief shop steward in a Clyde-side factory, Kirkwood led protests against the 11 1/2 (47.50) weekly wage for a skilled engineer. On police orders he was rousted out of bed and deported to Edinburgh, leaving six children to live on charity.

Imprisoned in an underground dungeon at Edinburgh Castle — "they treated the German prisoners better," he at last succeeded in gaining an audience with Winston Churchill, then munitions minister. He "bullied" Churchill into letting him go back to Clyde.

"I'll never forget that day," said the burly, keen-eyed Kirkwood. "I've always tried to lead an exemplary life. I don't drink, smoke, nor ride in automobiles, but there I was in prison like a criminal!"

Kirkwood helped build the first iron ship, the Black Prince. He never forgot his shipyard days. In the 1930s he persuaded the then Prince of Wales to use his influence in having work resumed on the vessel now known as the Queen Mary, which lay idle for years.

His proudest possession today is a gold watch, presented for winning the first penny-an-hour increase ever granted Scottish engineers. His parliamentary speeches are in strong, blunt English, salted with quotations from Burns and Gray. His themes are always the same — pride of craft, joy in his coat of heritage, an emphasis on the simple things. Contemptuous of class and caste, he has laughed off several attempts to give him a knighthood.
