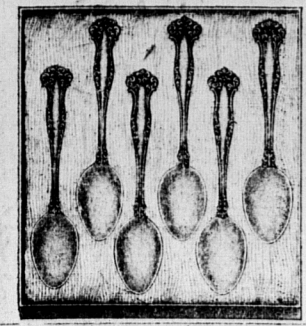

trations showing scenes in the most
places of historic interest visited.
