NICHOLAS MAY DIVORCE HIS MORGANATIC WIFE TO PLACATE KING CAROL

BERLIN, Nov. 7.—Reliable reports reaching Berlin tonight said that Prince Nicholas, of Roumania, brother of King Carol, would seal the final reconciliation with his royal family by divorcing his morganatic wife, on condition that certain high members of the Government appointed in his absence are deposed. Premier Valda Voceved was expected to be removed and named Roumanian Ambassador to Spain. A reshuffling of high army officers also were rumored.

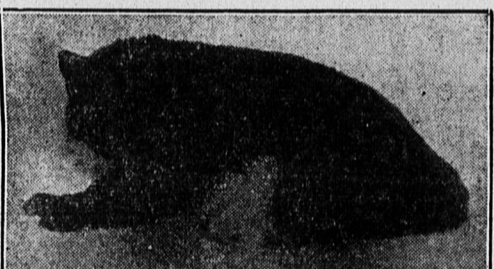
MACDONALD-PIPPERT
