Fred. McCourt, of Montreal, assistant-general sales agent of the Dominion Coal Company, is in the city on business connected with the Company.—Sydney exc. (Mr. McCourt is a native of Charlottetown.)

The Guardian correspondent has been informed that owing to the hail storm of some two weeks ago some of the farmers in the north side of St. Peter's Road, Lot 40—out at the Harbour, have had to cut their grain for green feed so badly was it battered down by the hail.

A meeting of those interested in the Martin Hay Tedder was held in the office of M. C. McGowan, Whim Road Cross, on Saturday evening, August 17th. S. M. Martin occupied the chair and gave an extended account of the development of the invention announcing at the same time the completion of the machine stating that it was securely protected by patents. He cordially thanked those who had co-operated with him in a financial way and recommended that steps be immediately taken to secure incorporation. Accordingly the following provisional Board of Directors was elected, namely:—Malcolm C. McGowan, farmer and merchant, President and member of Board of Directors; John E. McDonald, farmer, Vice-President and member of Board of Directors; Samuel M. Martin, farmer, Secretary-Treasurer and member of Board of Directors; Malcolm D. Martin, farmer, member of Board of Directors; Miles Martin, physician, member of Board of Directors. The Directors were instructed to incorporate under the corporate name of "The Martin Hay Tedder Co., Ltd."

A number of priests attached to parishes in the diocese of Antigonish held a meeting at Antigonish last week at which was discussed the coming ceremony of elevation to the bishopric of the diocese of Rev. Dr. James Morrison, Vernon River, P. E. I., in succession to the late Bishop Cameron. Rev. D. M. MacAdam speaking of the deliberations during the course of an address at Sacred Heart Church, Sunday, said the ceremony would in all probability take place at St. Ninian's Cathedral September 4. This date, however, was not decidedly settled on, as up to Friday no word has been had from the Apostolic delegate Mons. Stagni or Archbishop McCarthy at Halifax as to whether the date mentioned is a suitable one. It is practically assured that Archbishop McCarthy will be present and lead consecration ceremonies. Father MacAdam also stated there was every likelihood that the consecration of Fr. LeBlanc to the bishopric of St. John, N. B., would take place on Sept. 4. It is expected that outside the priests of the diocese of Antigonish there will be at least one hundred visiting priests from outside points attending the ceremonies. In closing the speaker paid tribute to Rev. Dr. McPherson, rector of St. Francis Xavier University, who, during the past two years has acted in the capacity of administrator of the diocese to the entire satisfaction of all concerned.—Sydney Post.
