CANNOT RESCUE CAPTAIN SCHROEDER

NOME, Alaska, April 10.—The break-up of the ice in the Behring Strait, is preventing the rescue of Captain W. Schroeder, master of the wrecked whaling schooner Morris, who is marooned in Big Diomed Island, where he was left by other survivors of the wreck of the Morris and the schooner Kittiwake, which were destroyed by the ice pack off the Siberian Coast last fall. Johan Koren, who was in command of the Scientific Expedition sent out on the Kittiwake by John F. Thayer, of Boston and other members of the party, made their way across the ice from the island to the Alaska mainland last month, but Captain Schroeder was too weak to accompany them.

Captain Schroeder is subsisting on beans and sugar. Reports received here say the flesh is falling off his hands and feet and it is feared he will die if rescues do not reach him soon.
