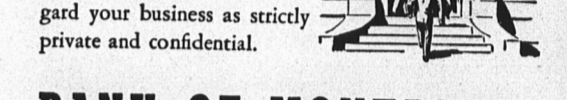

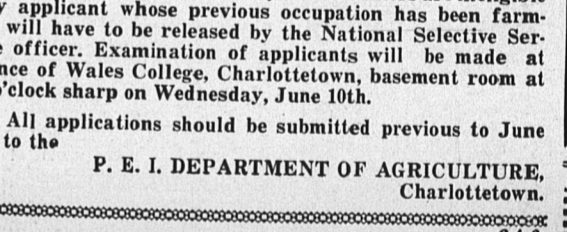

WAR EMERGENCY TRAINING

Training courses are now available in the following
classifications: Ship riveting, Ship plating, Machine tool op-
eration, Air craft metal work, Electrical work. Men under
30 years of age are not acceptable unless they produce evi-
dence that they are unfit for military service, or unless
they were married prior to July 1940. Farmers are ineligible
Any applicant whose previous occupation has been farm-
ing will have to be released by the National Selective Ser-
vice officer. Examination of applicants will be made at
Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, basement room at
10 o'clock sharp on Wednesday, June 10th.
