OUR REPRESENTATION.
 Sir:—You have done splendidly in pre-
 senting the case of this Island's claim to a
 return to the statu quo ante of our repre-
 sentation in the Dominion Commons. All
 patriotic Islanders must feel grateful to
 you, for this is the most vital question to
 which present attention should be direct-
 ed, it is a question involving our very ex-
 istence as a political entity in national
 affairs, a question involving the retention
 or loss of the already meagre safeguards
 of provincial rights. You and your
 several correspondents have at one time
 and another drawn attention to the Act
 itself, the intention of the parties to the
 contract and to the violation of the agree-
 ment; I do not remember to have seen the
 reasons given and explained why the
 people of pre-confederation days were so
 insistent on having more members than
 the ratio of population entitled us to under
 the terms agreed upon between the main-
 land Provinces. As this to my mind is
 the most important phase of the matter,
 you will pardon my presumption in asking
 you for space, as the bulk of the main-
 landers and I am sorry to see some of our
 own citizens imagine that we are asking
 for more than justice.
 For the purpose of making the matter
 plain I will enunciate the proposition
 being—Representation in the ratio of
 population would be unjust if applied in
 the case of P. E. I. in federal affairs.
 First because it is an Island Province,
 with characteristics all its own, which
 fact demands special representation. We
 will recount here only a few of the well
 known special differences between it and
 its sister Provinces:—We are occasionally
 cut off by reason of the ice entirely from
 the mainland, we have neither minerals
 nor fuel within our borders, the country
 had no lands for colonization when we
 joined the Union, we have special land
 laws, special school laws and special
 needs. Does the reader not see that these
 facts justify a large proportional voting
 power in a House where only six men
 have to meet and sway two hundred be-
 wildered mainlanders.
 But this is not all:—P. E. Island is the
 smallest Province in the union, this
 smallness coupled with individuality de-
 mands special recognition, because there
 is no special provision in the Canadian
 Constitution for rate-guarding provincia
 rights (except an appeal to the foot of the
 throne which as we know is like an ap-
 peal from Pilate to Herod); the Federal
 Union to the south of us give the State
 of Rhode Island and the State of Dela-
 ware the same voice (representation) in the
 national Senate as is given to the great
 States of New York and Texas, reserving
 such legislative functions for that branch
 of the Government as is necessary for the
 safeguarding of states rights. We have
 seen how that one state objecting to the
 ratification of a treaty of almost national
 importance prevented its passage, for
 besides the written law, made to protect
 the state against the nation, there is the
 unwritten law, known as "senatorial
 courtesy," which prevents a combina-
 tion of States from imposing on a weak State.
 Your readers are doubtless aware that
 Ireland is very much more largely repre-
 sented in the Imperial House of Com-
 mons than England, and yet not with-
 standing the obstructionist tactics of the
 Irish Nationalists, Englishmen refuse to
 reduce the ratio of Irish representation to
 population. So the new Australian
 Commonwealth reserves to the different
 Colonies a larger measure of protection
 than is accorded us. I mention these
 facts merely to show what liberty loving
 people like the Yankees, the English and
 Australians, consider justice in the case
 of the small sovereign States, the smaller
 integers which make up the United King-
 dom and the Southern Commonwealth.
 But is there anything more patent than
 the lesson which this very question of re-
 presentation reduced one sixth, though in
 the meantime our population increased nearly
 a sixth, and they threaten to reduce it
 by one third, though we have nearly 10,
 000 more people than we had when we
 demanded and would not accept less than
 six. This is a question of provincial rights
 and why should we be less able to
 guard them now than in 1873? Does it
 sound like justice to say that the bigger
 and stronger a little fellow's brothers
 grow in proportion to him, the greater
 right they have to destroy him or oppress
 him? Our smallness justly entitles us to all
 the rights the larger provinces have and
 one more: the right to be protected from
 such a wrong. If we were admitted to the
 Union under special terms as regards
 representation surely we are still entitled
 to these special terms. Personally I can-
 not see why the Dominion Parliament can
 hesitate for a moment in our case, or why
 the matter should be referred to any
 Court. Let our five remaining members
 give any Government to understand that

no Island member will ever vote to
 them so long as we are partly
 disfranchised. Every Island member
 should insist on our rights in this regard,
 for who would not would be a traitor, and
 "Doubly dying should go down to the
 vile earth from whence he sprung, un-
 wept, unhonored and unstung."
