EASTERN NOTES.—The rattle of the mower is now general and hay-making is progressing rapidly. Some are already done, and some in different stages. This is earlier than usual with us, but first the season is earlier, and secondly we cut the grass in a greener condition than did our fathers. As stated before, the crop is a short one from a dry season. The same cause has given us an unusual dose of potato bugs, and the supply of Paris green in the dealer's hands, being far short of the demand, the bug has benefited and the farmers are suffering loss. Horn flies are also in abundance, and make a bad combination with dry and bare pastures, as they seriously interfere with the supply of milk to our cheese factories, now such necessary and indispensable establishments.—Fishing is still dull; there is not the old rush for mackerel, as neither the quantity nor the price is encouraging. Some hake have been taken off West River where enough mackerel were hooked to bait the trawls; further west at Basin Head, Red Point or Little Harbor, but little is doing.
